- Fairfield, Iowa's new computerized wastewater system shut down March 10 and bypassed nearly 460,000 gallons of wastewater into Crow Creek. *Associated Press* (See item <u>16</u>)

Around 420 of its 29-ounce cans may not have been fully processed and contents could be contaminated by spoilage organisms or pathogens as a result. A wad of rags in a waste water pipe led to 133,825 gallons of untreated waste water being discharged into a tributary of Servis Creek, killing fish. Officials continued testing the water's quality after they used a high-pressure jet truck to clear the blockage and stop the overflow of raw sewage, which flowed for 2 ½ hours. The patron was subdued by two fellow patrons but not before shooting at least three including one who died, one who was critically injured, and a third who was shot in the arm.
