1. *April 28, Associated Press* – (Texas) **Thousands without power in Houston after storms.** Severe storms knocked out power to roughly 45,000 CenterPoint Energy customers in Houston April 27. Crews were working to restore service.

Crews determined a thief caused over \$150,000 in wire loss and damage, knocking out power in south Wichita, and likely suffered injuries during the theft.

3. *April 26, Seattle Times* – (Washington) **4 accused of stealing \$120K in copper wire from Seattle City Light.** Authorities arrested 4 suspects who claimed to be members of the Cherokee Nation and asked Seattle City Light for a small amount of copper to donate. They were granted access to the company's South Service Center April 23 and took roughly 40,000 pounds of insulated scrap copper wire worth about \$120,000. Police found all 4 individuals and took them into custody April 25.

17. *April 26, WBTV 3 Charlotte* – (North Carolina) **Two lanes of I-85 south in Charlotte reopen after HazMat spill.** A semi-truck broke apart along Interstate 85 southbound just past Little Rock Road in west Charlotte, spilling a 55-gallon drum of sodium bisulfide and prompting authorities close all lanes of the freeway for 5 hours while crews cleared up the spillage. Two news trucks were also quarantined and decontaminated after driving over the corrosive liquid.

18. *April 26, Los Angeles Times* – (California) **California 38 may shut down at least a week after tanker spill.** A fuel tanker overturned on Highway 38 near Angelus Oaks spilling 4,000 gallons of fuel, prompting the closure of a narrow 3 mile stretch of the highway for at least a week and perhaps several weeks. The fuel seeped into a nearby creek that feeds into the Santa Ana River, potentially contaminating local water supplies.

23. *April 28, Kalamazoo Gazette* – (Michigan) **Sewer spills 1,800 gallons of raw sewage in Kalamazoo's Oakland/Winchell neighborhood.** A 1,800 gallon raw sewage spill in Kalamazoo was caused by a sewer blockage which led to an overflow at a manhole April 27. City officials advised residents of the Oakland/Winchell neighborhood to stay out of the spill area until an assessment can be completed.

Nine temporary pumps were brought in to reduce the flow, but the plant still lacks capacity, leading to continued overflows.
27. *April 26, Associated Press* – (Michigan) **Grand Rapids: 429M gallons of wastewater released.** Grand Rapids retention basins suffered overflows from recent rainfall and flooding, sending 429 million gallons of partially treated sewage into the Grand River.
