- 1. *May 1, Salt Lake City Deseret News* (Utah) **Pipeline at Willard Bay fails pressurization test.** A stress test conducted April 29 on Chevron's pipeline that runs adjacent to Interstate 15 at Willard Bay State Park resulted in a failure between Bear River and Ogden. Operations were idled as authorities continue to investigate Chevron and the 760-mile pipeline that previously spilled fuel into the park and wetlands. - 2. *May 1, WFMJ 21Youngstown* (Ohio) **Oil well spill flows to nearby creek in Bristolville.** Roughly 1,600 gallons of oil leaked from an oil storage tank valve into a creek in Trumbull County. Crews worked to clean up the spill, expected to take several days, as officials investigate the incident.

- 3. *May 1, Greeley Tribune* (Colorado) **Nearly 35,000 Xcel customers affected by power outage; power is restored.** Severe weather knocked out power to roughly 35,000 Xcel Energy customers in Greeley, Winsor, and Gill, taking 3 substations off the grid. - 4. *April 29, KSTP 5 St. Paul* (Minnesota) **Fire mostly extinguished after Shakopee energy plant explosion.** Koda Energy officials announced areas of lingering fire at a biomass energy plant, caused by an explosion April 25 in 2 silos containing wood chips and oat hulls, were extinguished April 29. The plant is closed indefinitely while the cause of the explosion is under investigation.

Police have arrested a married couple in connection with the theft of a fuel tanker and 3,600 gallons of gas from the National Guard Armory in Colleton County. Authorities linked the two to the theft following a search of 2 homes after investigators determined they stole the military fuel tanker and returned it to the armory without its fuel.
