Top Stories

- Eight individuals were indicted in New York City for their alleged role in a cybercrime campaign that stole \$45 million from debit card issuers and withdrew the funds from ATMs. *Dark Reading* (See item 3)

The utility company has begun replacing copper wire with copper-clad wire due to increased copper theft.

Water and Wastewater Systems Sector

- 19. *May 9, WTKR 3 Norfolk* (Virginia) **Residents advised to avoid water in Elizabeth River after wastewater leak.** Residents were advised to avoid the Elizabeth River in Norfolk for 24 hours after a contractor damaged the drain of a tank and caused partially-treated wastewater to leak into the river. Officials indicated the treatment process was not affected by the incident and are working to repair the damaged tank. - 20. *May 9, KTRK 13 Houston* (Texas) **Nearly half a million gallons of untreated sewage leaks into Sims Bayou in SE Houston.** A partial power outage at a lift station on the Gulf Freeway May 8 led to nearly 500,000 gallons of sewage spilling into Sims

Bayou. Houston's Department of Public Works and Engineering indicated no fish were killed as a result of the spill, there was no threat to the public, and the water flow is back to normal.

21. *May 9, Buffalo News* – (New York) **20 Buffalo VA patients test positive for hepatitis.** Testing at the Buffalo Veterans Affairs Medical Center determined 20 veterans have tested positive for hepatitis in the wake of an investigation into the facility for the misuse of insulin pens on diabetic patients that could have been contaminated with hepatitis or HIV. Although it was not determined the veterans contracted the hepatitis from the center, authorities are continuing to alert the public and test for possible exposure.

The investigation is ongoing, but the hospital responded to the report with a detailed corrective plan after they came under scrutiny for releasing patients without proper care once they reached their destinations.

The law enforcement officers worked in conjunction with an immigration lawyer who paid them to secure admission stamps and lawful permanent residence status for more than 35 clients.
