Following a multistate Salmonella outbreak and massive product recall in 2012, Sunland, Inc. resumed operations after a 6-month suspension. Sunland, Inc. was the first food manufacturer to be shut down by new U.S. Food and Drug Administration powers in November 2012 after its products were shown to have

sickened at least 42 people in 20 States with Salmonella Bredeney.

- 18. *May 23, Corvallis Gazette-Times* (Oregon) **2,400 gallons of sewage into Portland river.** A Portland city spokesman reported grease blocking a sewer pipe led to an overflow of a public toilet and allowed 2,400 gallons of sewage to spill into Portland's Waterfront Park and eventually into the Willamette River. Although maintenance workers cleared the line and stopped the release, residents were encouraged to avoid contact with the river water because of elevated bacteria levels.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency fined three water treatment plants in Indiana and Venango counties a total of \$83,000 for dumping fracking waste in Allegheny River tributaries and levied an additional \$30 million financial obligation for the upgrading of the three treatment facilities to comply with newer, stricter State-issued wastewater discharge standards. A 50,000 to 55,000 pound slab collapsed on a ramp between the third floor and second floor of a parking garage under construction at the Westfield Montgomery Mall in Bethesda, killing one man and trapping and wounding another for 4 hours May 23. Local traffic was impacted during the afternoon and evening.
