15. *May 26, KGBT 4 Harlingen* – (Texas) **Highway 77 chemical leak sends firefighters to hospital.** Southbound lanes of Highway 77 in Kenedy County were shut down for several hours after a truck, carrying multiple chemicals caught fire and spilled chlorine tablets and calcium hypochlorite onto the road May 25. Three firefighters were admitted to a hospital in Corpus Christi because of chemical exposure.

The ramp from Interstate 85 northbound to Loop Road in Hartsfield was shut down for about 3 hours due to the crash.
