Michigan-based Lipari Foods issued a voluntary recall of its Raw Sunflower Seeds, Roasted Sunflower Seeds, and Snack Mixes June 12 after testing determined the raw sunflower seeds were contaminated with Listeria. The company is investigating the source of the contamination and believes the bacteria likely originated from the supplier.
