- 1. July 3, Pueblo Chieftain (Colorado) Agreement shuts down coal-fired plant. The Arkansas River Power Authority will close their coal-fired power plant in Lamar and send \$125,000 to clean energy projects in southeastern Colorado in an agreement with WildEarth Guardians July 2. The settlement resolves two enforcement lawsuits which claim the utility allegedly violated the Clean Air Act at their coal-fired power plant. - 2. *July 2, Salt Lake Tribune* (Utah) **Utah coal-fired power plant fined for excess pollution.** The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency reached a settlement with Utah-based Deseret Generation & Transmission Co-operative July 2 which secured Deseret's commitment to significantly reducing emissions of particulate pollution and visible emissions from the Bonanza plant. South Jordan-Deseret Power will pay \$35,000 in penalties and install new controls during startup and shutdown, and cover the cost of replacing at least 5 fleet vehicles with natural gas models.

The company plans on shutting down or deactivating power plants across Hawaii by 2018 in a cost cutting measure that will save the company millions.
