1. *July 20, Las Vegas Review-Journal* – (Nevada) **Massive thunderstorm slams Las Vegas, leaving damaged homes, power outages and uprooted trees.** NV Energy crews worked to restore power to 33,000 customers throughout the Las Vegas area after a severe thunderstorm swept through July 19 causing evacuations, severed gas lines, and standing water on casino floors.

2. *July 19, Associated Press – (Pennsylvania)* **DOE study finds fracking chemicals didn't taint water.** The U.S. Department of Energy issued preliminary findings of a study that determined there was no evidence showing that chemicals from the natural gas drilling process moved up to contaminate drinking water aquifers at a western Pennsylvania drilling site. The study is ongoing however, and researchers found that chemical-laced fluids used to free gas trapped deep below the surface stayed thousands of feet below the shallower areas that supplied drinking water.
