- The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission and U.S. Department of Justice filed two lawsuits against Bank of America for allegedly making misleading statements and failing to disclose important information ahead of a sale of \$850 million of residential mortgage-backed securities in 2008. *Reuters* (See item 8)

Repairs to the Red Lion dike are expected to last until November 2013, cost approximately \$7 million, and are being completed to avoid large-scale flooding issues which would also affect sewer and railroad infrastructure and cause transportation issues.
