- Entergy Corp. announced that the Vermont Yankee Nuclear Power Station in Vernon, Vermont, will shut down permanently by the end of 2014, citing costs and market conditions. *Associated Press* (See item 2)

Findings in Texas differ from results found in Iowa and Nebraska, which linked some Cyclospora cases to eating a bagged salad mix from Taylor Farms at certain restaurants.
