A former Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) employee pleaded guilty September 26 to stealing over \$1 million from the utility after authorities discovered he diverted checks written to SPU from developers and homeowners for projects and installations and deposited them into his private account. He was charged in March 2012, a year after officials audited the utility's financial controls and fired four other employees for improper access.

UGI-Penn Natural Gas will pay a \$1 million civil penalty after the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission approved a settlement September 26 due to alleged allegations that the utility was not compliant with State and federal regulations following repairs made to gas leaks in April 2012. The utility will also conduct third-party audits and implement computer recording and tracking of leak survey results.
