1. *November 1, Lexington Herald-Leader* – (Kentucky) **KU crews working to finish fixing power outages in Lexington.** Heavy rains and high winds October 31 caused Kentucky Utility crews to work to restore power to more than 36,270 customers November 1 after they lost service due to downed electrical lines and power poles.

12. *November 1, KPIX 5 San Francisco; Associated Press* – (Arizona) **Flight forced to land in San Francisco and wait on runway for four hours after suspected bomb threat.** A suspicious package onboard a United Express Flight 5573 plane from San Francisco to San Antonio forced an emergency landing at the Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport and the evacuation of 46 passengers October 31. Authorities searched the plane but found nothing dangerous; the FBI is investigating the incident. 13. *November 1, Santa Fe New Mexican* – (New Mexico) **Broken gas line snarls rush-hour traffic.** A damaged natural-gas line during a city landscaping project closed

- Airport Road between Calle Atajo and South Meadows Drive in Santa Fe, and caused the evacuation of residents at the Vista Alegre Apartments and at a nearby shopping complex for over 4 hours while crews worked to fix the damaged pipe October 31.
