Top Stories

- Over 321,000 customers across the Midwest were without power after a storm produced an outbreak of tornados and powerful winds, causing damage in several States. CNN (See item 1)

Nuclear Reactors, Materials, and Waste Sector

- 2. November 18, Associated Press (International) Fuel removal from Japan's crippled nuclear plant is first step toward full cleanup. Workers at the damaged Fukushima nuclear power plant in Japan began removing fuel rods from the Unit 4 reactor November 18 as part of a process of securing the fuel and cleaning up the plant. The 1,533 sets of fuel rods, including 202 used sets, are expected to be moved to a safer storage location by the end of 2014.

- 3. November 18, Nuclear Street (Pennsylvania) Cesium-137 found in Pennsylvania scrapyard. Radiation detectors at the Coatesville Scrap facility detected a radiation source October 31 that was identified as cesium-137, according to a U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission report made public November 15. The small piece of metal was removed from a scrap pile by workers and placed in a sealed lead pipe until a NRC inspector could examine it.

An accident involving carbon monoxide present after an explosives accident at the Revenue Virginius gold, silver, and sulfides mine in Ouray County November 17 killed 2 miners and injured 20 others. State and federal mine safety

regulators are investigating.

- 5. November 16, Providence Journal (Rhode Island; Puerto Rico) 2 arrested on federal identity-theft charges by Homeland Security. Two individuals in Providence, Rhode Island, were arrested and charged November 15 with allegedly running an identity theft, money laundering, and tax fraud scheme that mostly targeted victims living in Puerto Rico. The pair allegedly obtained more than \$277,300 in federal tax checks using stolen identities, and then laundered the money through several accounts. - 6. November 15, Reuters (National) JPMorgan Chase to pay \$4.5 billion in mortgage security deal. JPMorgan Chase & Co. agreed November 15 to pay \$4.5 billion to settle the claims of 21 institutional investors who lost money on mortgage-backed securities issued by the company and Bear Stearns, which was later taken over by JPMorgan. - 7. November 15, Leesburg Today (Virginia) Third conspirator found guilty in mortgage fraud scheme. A former loan officer at First Empire Mortgage and Lifetime Financial Services was found guilty November 15 of falsifying loan applications and helping recruit straw buyers in a \$19.9 mortgage fraud scheme in the Northern Virginia area.
