The North Dakota Public Service Commission approved two pipeline projects December 30 totaling \$19 million that will carry petroleum byproducts from a new diesel refinery near Dickinson to a nearby rail hub and help reduce truck traffic on State Highway 22.

A report by the Air Combat Command Accident Investigation Board concluded that a mechanical malfunction which created a fuel leak caused the crash of an Ellsworth Air Force Base B-1B bomber during an August 2013 training exercise near Broadus, Montana. The aircraft was destroyed, while its four crew members were ejected with non-life threatening injuries.
