- Austin, Texas-based medical device manufacturer ArthroCare Corporation agreed to pay \$30 million to resolve charges that senior executives in the company engaged in a securities fraud scheme that caused shareholders to lose over \$400 million. U.S. Department of Justice (See item 4)

Portions of Interstate 35 in Carrollton were shut down for several hours January 7 after a semi-truck carrying a load of utility poles rear-ended a vehicle, causing the semi-truck to overturn and spill diesel and its utility poles on the highway. Both drivers were sent to the hospital for minor injuries.

The Washington Department of Ecology worked to remove around 6,000 gallons of ethanol the semi-truck was carrying.

- 11. *January 7, Rapid City Journal* (South Dakota) **Half a million gallons likely lost after crew breaks water main.** A work crew accidentally ruptured a 12-inch highpressure PVC main in Rapid City January 7, causing around 500,000 gallons of water to be lost before water could be shut off and the line repaired.

Once the crane was secured into a safe position operations resumed at the shipyard.

21. *January 7, Washington Post* – (Virginia) **Loudoun schools' data accidentally breached.** The Loudoun County school system in Virginia notified parents and employees after learning of an accidental security breach of personal data left unprotected through a third party vendor, Risk Solutions International, in 2013. An employee working on the school district's emergency management Web site mistakenly removed some security features, leaving the data online without password protection.

22. January 7, Boston Globe – (Massachusetts) BU employees' direct-deposit pay stolen through alleged Internet scam. Boston University temporarily shut down its electronic payroll system after learning that the system was breached through a phishing scam where scammers allegedly stole monthly direct-deposit paychecks from 10 university employees in December 2013 by changing their username and password information after obtaining their log-in credentials. Another 68 employees had work-related accounts accessed by an outside device, but officials do not believe any sensitive information was retrieved.

23. January 7, CBS News; Associated Press – (New York) Cops, firefighters among 100 former NYC workers charged in disability scam. More than 100 retired individuals were charged in New York City January 7 including 72 city police officers, 8

firefighters, 5 corrections officers, and 1 Nassau County Police Department officer with faking or exaggerating psychiatric problems to get federal disability benefits. Officials announced that four ringleaders coached the former workers on how to falsely describe symptoms of mental health issues while receiving kickbacks after the workers got payouts as high as \$500,000.

A hacker exploited a vulnerability in vBulletin to deface the forums of the openSUSE Linux distribution and download a database containing the usernames and email addresses of around 80,000 users.

26. January 8, Softpedia – (International) Expert finds clickjacking flaw in Google and open redirect in Facebook. A security researcher identified and reported an open URL redirect vulnerability in Facebook that could be used to redirect users to other sites and a clickjacking flaw in the Google Maps site that could have been exploited to alter a user's Google+ profile and hijack their webcam. Both vulnerabilities were closed by Facebook and Google.
