On-the-ground stress testing of the U.S. Marine Corps (USMC) version of Lockheed Martin's F-35 jet revealed cracks in 3 of 6 of the test aircraft's bulkheads, leading to a structural redesign and the development of structural retrofits. The finding does not impact current F-35B flying operations and is not expected to delay the USMC's 2015 Initial Operations Capability date.

- 21. *February 25, Softpedia* (International) **Cybercriminals use Pony botnet to steal 700,000 account credentials, virtual currencies.** Experts found that cybercriminals managed to steal more than 700,000 credentials for Web sites, email accounts, File Transfer Protocol (FTP) servers, Secure Shell (SSH), and Virtual Desktops utilizing the Pony botnet. The botnet was also used to steal \$220,000 worth of virtual currencies targeting Bitcoin and other virtual currency wallets.

23. February 23, Dark Reading – (International) Researchers bypass protections in Microsoft's EMET security tool. Bromium Labs researchers found a flaw in Microsoft's Enhanced Mitigation Experience Toolkit (EMET) 4.1 that could potentially allow attackers to sneak malware past it through bypassing several key defenses, taking advantage of its reliance on known vectors of return-oriented programming (ROP) exploitation attack methods.
