Top Stories

- Ohio-based Smucker's fruit spread company shut down its online store after it discovered that attackers breached the company's systems and may have obtained customers' payment card and personal information. *Softpedia* (See item 6)

1. *March 4, KOAT 7 Albuquerque* – (New Mexico) **Man to spend night at hospital after oil rig fire.** A LF Well Service oil rig in Lybrook was shut down indefinitely after a March 4 fire that damaged the rig and left two men injured.

- March 5, KSLA 12 Shreveport (Louisiana) Fire at N. Caddo chemical plant under control. UOP Honeywell halted production March 5 at its North Caddo Parish chemical facility after a fire broke out near one of the production lines March 5. Some crew members were decontaminated after handling the spill and clearing the scene.

 March 4 after an issue involving the reactor feedwater heaters and turbine was detected.

8. *March 5*, *KYW 3 Philadelphia* – (Pennsylvania) **Driver arrested for DUI after I-95 southbound crash.** Authorities are investigating an accident on southbound Interstate 95 in Philadelphia March 5 where a semi-truck sideswiped a car, lost control, and overturned, causing a portion of southbound I-95 to shut down for about 5 hours. The driver of the semi-truck was taken to a local hospital in critical condition and the driver of the car was arrested for driving under the influence.

approximately 12,000 cases of two varieties of its World Baby line of pouch products due to intermittent damage to the plastics spouts during manufacturing that may present a choking hazard.

March 4, U.S. Food and Drug Administration (Illinois; Indiana; Wisconsin) HC Schau and Sons issues allergy alert on undeclared pine nuts in 'Fresh To Go' Tuscan Style Combo on Tomato Basil Bread (sandwich). HC Schau and Son issued a recall of its 8-ounce units of Fresh To Go Tuscan Style Combo on Tomato Basil Bread after the company prepared the product using an incorrect ingredient provided by its supplier, and unknowingly failed to declare pine nuts on the label.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration announced March 3 that Lehigh Valley Dairy recalled some Lehigh Valley, Swiss Premium, and Price Chopper brand orange juice products due to a manufacturing error that mixed undeclared milk with the juice. - 17. *March 3, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* (National) **Twin Marquis, Inc issues allergy alert on undeclared milk in specific lots of its Cooked Noodle and Lo Mein Noodle.** Twin Marquis, Inc., of New York City recalled some of its Cooked Noodle and Lo Mein Noodle products due to undeclared milk after officials found that the product contained dried whole egg powder, potentially containing undeclared milk. 18. *March 5, KOMO 4 Seattle* – (Washington) **Water main break creates havoc in Bellevue neighborhood.** Residents in a Bellevue neighborhood were without water and at least one house was flooded after a ruptured 6-inch water main sent thousands of gallons water gushing down streets March 5. Service was shut off indefinitely until repairs and cleanup could be completed.

Researchers with the French National Institute for Research in Computer Science and Control developed a new man-in-the-middle (MitM) attack against the Transport Level Security (TLS) protocol that can under certain conditions allow an attacker to intercept a user's login credentials and disguise themselves as the user on servers that accept the same credential.

Red Hat and GnuTLS issued patches for users and advised them to apply the patch promptly.

31. *March 5*, *KYW 3 Philadelphia* – (New Jersey) **Probe continues into deadly blast in New Jersey.** One person died and 7 utility workers were injured March 4 after a suspected gas-related explosion that destroyed 12 homes and left the occupants of 55 other units at the South Fork Housing Community in Ewing Township temporarily displaced. Officials are investigating the incident, but believe a utility contractor working at the complex may have struck and damaged a gas line shortly before the explosion.

32. *March 5*, *KDVR 31 Denver* – (Colorado) **2 injured in 3-alarm condo fire in Adams County near 88th and Corona.** Firefighters responded to a 3-alarm fire that burned 2 buildings of the Corona Village Condominiums complex in Adams County March 4. Two contractors working on the property were injured by the blaze, and the residents of up to 96 units were displaced.
