1. *March 10, Raleigh News & Observer* – (North Carolina) **Duke Energy still must restore 79,000 outages from storm; Orange schools closed.** Duke Energy crews continued work to restore power to about 79,000 customers in North Carolina that remained without service after a severe winter storm. Officials decided to close Orange County schools March 10 due to downed trees and power lines.

2. *March 7*, *WBOY 12 Clarksburg* – (West Virginia) **WV DEP investigating oil spill near West Union.** An estimated 800-1,000 gallons of oil leaked from a private well near West Union and into an unnamed tributary which flowed into Tom's Fork Creek March 6, the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection reported. Preliminary results found a pipe in the well may have frozen over and burst, resulting in the spill.

3. *March 7, Reuters* – (Texas) **Shell says Ho-Ho pipeline shut after leak in Texas.** Royal Dutch Shell shut down its Houston-to-Houma (Ho-Ho) pipeline March 6 after construction crew members punctured the pipeline near Port Neches, Texas, releasing 364 barrels of crude oil.
