Chemical Industry Sector

1. *March 19, Nashua Telegraph* – (New Hampshire) **Merrimack chemical firm fined by EPA.** The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) fined JCI Jones Chemicals Inc., of Merrimack almost \$41,000 to resolve allegations that the company failed to adequately evaluate risks associated with sorting and handling chlorine and sulfur dioxide in proximity to incompatible chemicals. The EPA also alleged that the company waited 10 hours to report to authorities a June 2010 chemical leak from a ruptured storage tank.

- 5. *March 19, The Register* (International) **'Zotob' hacker 'Diablo' arrested in Bangkok after three-year hunt.** A Moroccan suspected of causing \$4 billion in damages to Swiss banking systems was arrested in Thailand and faces extradition to Switzerland. The man was previously arrested and jailed in Morocco for spreading the Zotob worm that infected systems around the world, including a U.S. government Web site.

State Police in Carlisle believe that the suspect who robbed an M&T Bank branch in South Middleton Township March 18 was the same suspect responsible for two bank robberies in Boiling Springs. The three robberies also caused partial lockdowns at South Middleton School District schools since February 27. - 8. *March 19*, *Associated Press* (Washington) **Seattle looks at helipad rules after deadly crash.** Authorities are investigating after a KOMO-TV 4 Seattle news helicopter plummeted into an intersection near the Seattle Center campus March 18, setting three cars on fire and killing two people on board. A third person suffered extensive injuries while escaping from their burning car.

11. *March 18, San Francisco Bay City News* – (National) **Krave beef jerky recalled due to safety concerns.** The Monterey County Health Department in California announced a recall for Krave Jerky's Garlic Chili Pepper Beef Jerky due to the possibility that the product may contain meat from a previous Rancho Feeding Corp., recall which concluded that the company was processing diseased and unsound animals without a full federal inspection.

ConAgra Foods Inc., was cited by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration March 17 for 13 safety violations at the company's Columbus flour mill, with proposed fines totaling \$117,000. March 17 that Fannie May Confections Brands, Inc., recalled 14 ounce packages of its spring wrapped assorted chocolates due to undeclared peanuts.

14. *March 17, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Simply Natural Foods, LLC issues allergy alert for high levels of milk protein in Simply Lite Dark Chocolate Bars.** Simply Natural Foods, LLC voluntarily recalled its 3 ounce Simply Lite Dark Chocolate Bar after U.S. Food and Drug Administration testing revealed the product contains high levels of milk protein, while the labeling only claims the product may contain traces of milk.

15. *March 19, Connecticut Post* – (Connecticut) **Uranium found in Stamford well water.** The Connecticut Department of Public Health reported that 70 percent of the 5 dozen private wells in the Stamford area sampled since January 2014 tested positive for uranium contamination and officials urged homeowners to test drinking water. The department is expected to complete water testing across 30 to 40 towns throughout the State by the fall of 2014.

The improvements will reduce the amount of bacteria in storm water being directly discharged into the lake and help reduce the number of bacteria-related beach closures. The information was gathered through a Web-based program used by the health center's accounting staff and somehow available through Internet searches.

- 19. *March 19*, *WRAL 5 Raleigh* (North Carolina) **Students, drivers injured in school bus wreck near Johnston County school.** At least 8 students were transported to an area hospital while several others were treated at the scene of an accident involving a school bus in Johnston County March 19. Authorities closed North Carolina Highway 50 for about 2 hours after the accident.

27. *March 19*, *Softpedia* – (International) **Expert finds RCE flaw in Yahoo after logging in with "Admin/Admin" credentials.** A security researcher identified and reported a flaw in a Hong Kong subdomain of Yahoo that allowed him to gain read/write/execute permissions by entering a default login name and password. The issue was reported February 20 and fixed February 21.

28. *March 19*, *Softpedia* – (International) **Mozilla releases Firefox 28**, **fixes vulnerabilities presented at Pwn2Own.** Mozilla released Firefox 28, the newest version of its Web browser, adding new features and closing 18 vulnerabilities identified during the Pwn2Own 2014 security competition.

One campaign used spear phishing emails targeting U.S. financial institutions while a second was an indiscriminate spam campaign.

One firefighter suffered serious injuries after a wall collapsed, and two other individuals were treated for smoke inhalation.
