- A truck spilled 300 gallons of potassium hydroxide and 300 gallons of phosphoric acid March 19, prompting officials to close Butterfield Road for about 5 hours and Route 60 in Lake County, Illinois, for nearly 8 hours while crews investigated and cleaned up the spill.

Chemical Industry Sector

1. *March 19, KWGS 89.5 FM Tulsa* – (National) **Oklahoma chemical company settles with EPA and DEQ, agrees to pay fines and reduce emissions.** LSB Industries Inc., entered into a settlement with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality March 18 to resolve allegations that the company violated the Clean Air Act when modifications were made to its facilities that resulted in increased emissions of nitrogen oxides (NOx). The company paid \$725,000 in penalties and agreed to reduce emissions of NOx by 800 tons per year. 2. *March 19, Associated Press* – (Alabama) **Browns Ferry reactor shut down by turbine problem.** The Unit 3 reactor at the Browns Ferry Nuclear Plant near Athens, Alabama, automatically shut down March 18 after an issue with a turbine on the non-nuclear side of the plant occurred while the plant was being brought back online after an outage.

Schneider Electric announced a recall of around 28,400 Square D-branded F and K frame circuit breakers March 18 because the breakers can fail to trip when an overload occurs, presenting a fire, burn, and shock hazard. 4. *March 19, Bloomberg News* – (National) **Pentagon holds back \$231 million from Lockheed for F-35 fixes.** The Defense Contract Management Agency announced that as much as \$231 million is being withheld from Lockheed Martin Corp., until the contractor completes necessary retrofits to F-35 aircraft already delivered to the military. The modifications were identified during a simultaneous development and production project, and were not caused by defective parts.

A truck spilled two tanks containing 300 gallons of potassium hydroxide and two tanks containing 300 gallons of phosphoric acid March 19, prompting officials to close Butterfield Road for about 5 hours and Route 60 in Vernon Hills, Lake County for nearly 8 hours while crews investigated and cleaned up the spill. 9. *March* 20, *Bergen Record* – (New Jersey; New York) **Port approves \$1B plan to improve GWB.** The Port Authority Board of Commissioners authorized a \$1 billion project March 19 to improve the George Washington Bridge spanning from Manhattan's Washington Heights to Fort Lee, which will include replacing suspension ropes and sidewalks on the structure. The projected is slated to begin in 2017 with an estimated completion date of 2024.

12. *March 19*, *NJ.com* – (New Jersey) **4,500 gallons of liquid fertilizer spill into Raritan River from Long Valley farm.** A malfunctioning valve on a fertilizer tank resulted in a multi-agency clean-up effort at the Harbe-Dan Farm in Washington Township, New Jersey, March 18, after about 4,500 gallons of liquid fertilizer spilled from the tank into the Raritan River. Water samples showed a neutral pH level, and officials believe no threat was posed to humans, wildlife, or marine life as a result of the spill. Source:

15. *March* 20, *Harrisburg Patriot-News* – (Pennsylvania) **Water main break believed cause of sinkhole on South 14th Street in Harrisburg.** A water main break March 20 resulted in a sinkhole on South 14th Street in Harrisburg, prompting the temporary evacuation of about 45 houses after water service was shut off due to repair work. Crews reported to the scene to assess how long repairs would take.

- 16. *March 20*, *Associated Press* (Iowa) **Pipe break sends 50,000 gallons of wastewater into Mississippi River.** Crews removed 4,500 gallons of wastewater after a March 18 break in a force main released 50,000 gallons of raw domestic wastewater into the Mississippi River near Clinton, Iowa. The Iowa Department of Natural Resources is monitoring the situation and do not believe dilution will pose a threat. The main use for the new version of Darlloz was found to be mining for virtual currencies such as Dogecoin and Mincoin.
