### Top Stories

- A 16-inch water main that broke April 6 and spilled over 5 million gallons of water in Petersburg, Virginia, and caused low-water pressure for some residents who were placed under a 24-hour boil advisory through April 9. – *Petersburg Progress-Index* (See item [12](#))
- Authorities are investigating a fire at a Missouri State Highway Patrol maintenance building in Jefferson City that caused about 10 patrol vehicles to be total losses with total damage ranging from \$4 million to \$5 million. – *KRCG 13 Jefferson City* (See item [17](#))
- Microsoft ended support April 8 for its Windows XP operating system, leaving the widely-used operating system vulnerable to any vulnerabilities identified in the future. – *CNNMoney* (See item [19](#))

1. *April 7, Bristol Herald Courier* – (Virginia) **From coal to natural gas.** The process to convert two units of the Clinch River Power Plant in Russell County from coal-fired to natural gas began after authorities determined the two units will burn coal through the summer of 2014 before one unit is taken offline for conversion in the fall of 2015, while the second will be converted in early 2016. Company officials stated that both units will be fully converted by spring of 2016.

## **Transportation Systems Sector**

6. *April 7, Associated Press* – (Indiana) **State officials close 2nd highway in southeastern Indiana over sinking pavement.** The Indiana Department of Transportation closed a portion of State Road 262 April 7 due to unstable soil causing sinking pavement and threatening the stability of the road and the safety of drivers. The closure was the second State closure in less than a week for the same issue.

7. *April 7, Waco Tribune-Herald* – (Texas) **Trains collide derailing locomotive, 14 cars.** Two trains collided south of Kosse in Falls County April 6, causing 1 of the locomotives and 14 rail cars to derail, as well as a minor diesel fuel leak. Two Union Pacific Railroad workers were injured and crews worked to repair the tracks and restore rail traffic by April 7.

10. *April 8, Food Safety News* – (National) **FDA issues nine warning letters to food manufacturers, processors.** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued warning letters to nine food manufacturers and processors nationwide in March, addressing violations of federal law that were discovered during inspections. The FDA requested written responses from each party detailing steps taken to bring the firms into compliance and to correct the infractions, as well as to prevent their recurrence.

11. *April 7, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **H Group, Inc. issues voluntary allergen alert on undeclared allergens in Caesar Salad with Caesar Dressing.** H Group Inc., voluntarily recalled 509 units of its Trader Giotto's Caesar Salad with Caesar Dressing products sold in Trader Joe's stores due to undeclared wheat, soy, egg, and fish. The issue was with H Group's packaging process, which has since been resolved.

## **Water and Wastewater Systems Sector**

12. *April 8, Petersburg Progress-Index* – (Virginia) **City loses 5 million gallons of water; boil advisory continues.** A 16-inch water main that broke April 6 and spilled over 5 million gallons of water in Petersburg, Virginia, caused flooding that blocked part of South Crater Road for several hours and caused low-water pressure for some residents. Affected residents were placed under a 24-hour boil advisory through April 9 due to a risk of water contamination while free bottled water was also made available.

13. *April 7, Stanford Interior-Journal* – (Kentucky) **Hustonville cashes \$150,000 CD to pay for water tower upgrade.** The Hustonville City Council agreed to use a \$150,000 savings account to fund the Hustonville water tower project that is estimated to cost \$89,000 to resurface the tank and install a mixing system that improves water quality. Any leftover funds will be used as a buffer for expenses related to a water system upgrade to replace old water lines.

14. *April 8, KMGH 7 Denver* – (Colorado) **30 kids, 1 teacher decontaminated during hazmat incident at JeffCo Open School; 7 taken to hospital.** Jefferson County Open School in Lakewood, Colorado, was closed April 8 after an April 7 HAZMAT situation that required the decontamination of 30 students and 1 teacher, which included the transportation of 7 individuals to area hospitals. Authorities evacuated the school and an investigation determined an irritant on the school playground caused a reaction.

15. *April 7, KNSD 39 San Diego* – (California) **Suspicious vehicle reported at Naval Base in San Diego.** Two gates at U.S. Naval Base in San Diego were closed for 5 hours and an area near the commissary and NEX were evacuated while military police investigated a suspicious vehicle April 7. Officials inspected and cleared the vehicle after determining no bombs were present.

The operating system is still used on a significant portion of systems, including personal computers, ATMs, medical systems, industrial control systems, and other critical infrastructure systems.

20. *April 8, Softpedia* – (International) **OpenSSL 1.0.1g released to prevent hackers from eavesdropping on communications.** A new version of OpenSSL was released after security researchers from Codenomicon and Google Security identified and reported a vulnerability that exposes all data transmissions, encryption keys, usernames, passwords, and other content via a memory leak known as Heartbleed. The vulnerability affects a variety of applications and users are advised to update as soon as possible.

- building. Some roadways remained closed due to flooding and debris April 7.

26. *April 7, Oklahoma City Oklahoman* – (Oklahoma) **Five hospitalized, three arrested after Oklahoma City nightclub shooting.** Police responded to a gang-related shooting that started inside Club Rush nightclub in Oklahoma City and continued into a parking lot April 6, leaving at least 5 people injured. Investigators are searching for suspects and additional victims connected to the incident.

A nearby apartment building was evacuated while responders extinguished the blaze.
