## **Top Stories**

- Operations at the Finger Lakes Farmstead Cheese facility in Trumansburg, New York, were suspended April 28 due to unsanitary conditions at the plant and Listeria that was found in raw cow's milk cheese at the facility. Food Poisoning Bulletin (See item 11)
- Boston Medical Center in Massachusetts notified about 15,000 patients that that their personal records were posted without password protection on MDF Transcription Services' Web site after discovering the breach March 4. *Boston Globe* (See item 14)
- A storm system that moved through several U.S. States left at least 34 dead, prompted more than 100 commercial properties and 2,000 homes to report damage, and forced several school districts to close April 30. *Reuters* (See item <u>26</u>)
- A 4-alarm fire that began in one building of the Fairfield Inn hotel in Palm Desert, California, April 28 caused \$8 million in damage and put the hotel's second building in danger of collapsing. *Palm Springs Desert Sun* (See item 27)

1. April 28, Charleston Gazette – (West Virginia) MSHA issues citation in McElroy Mine death. The U.S. Mine Safety and Health Administration cited McElroy Coal Co., a former CONSOL Energy subsidiary, in the October 2013 death of a coal miner at the McElroy Mine in Marshall County, a report released April 28 stated. An investigation determined the mine operator did not guarantee all employees were positioned safely during the setup of a longwall mining machine contributing to the miner's death after he was hit in the head when a conveyer chain broke while the machine was being moved.

3. April 29, U.S. Department of Labor – (Wisconsin) US Department of Labor's OSHA fines Cooper Power Systems \$166,000 after multiple workers injured by acid mixture at South Milwaukee plant. The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Cooper Power Systems for six violations at its South Milwaukee plant that occurred during an October 30, 2013 acid spill at the facility which injured seven workers. Proposed fines totaled \$166,000. Source:

- 4. April 30, U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (Utah) SEC charges Utahbased retirement plan administrator with defrauding investors. The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission announced charges and an asset freeze April 30 against the founder, president, and CEO of Utah-based American Pension Services Inc., accusing the businessman of losing over \$22 million in investor funds through high-risk investments and then issuing inflated account statements to hide the losses. He also allegedly used forged letters and signatures to invest funds on behalf of investors and continued to collect fees on defaulted promissory notes.

- 5. April 29, Merrillville Post-Tribune (Indiana) 2 indicted on federal charges of gift card, credit card fraud. Federal prosecutors unsealed an indictment April 29 against two men arrested in Hobart during March in possession of 352 suspicious gift cards, alleging that the men are part of a large identity theft ring run by West African nationals in the U.S.

Authorities are investigating after 5 railcars mixed with a local train out of Greenville and CSX freight derailed April 30 causing 2 of the cars to begin leaking ammonium polyphosphate. The train trestle over Charles Boulevard in Greenville remained closed while crews worked to contain the leak and clear the scene. - 12. April 30, Wilkes-Barre Citizens' Voice (Pennsylvania) Utility restores service after pair of water main breaks. Two separate water main breaks of 10-inch and 14-inch water mains April 29 caused more than 100 Pennsylvania American Water customers in Luzerne County to be without water service for more than 9 hours. A local road was damaged at one break site, and city road crews were dispatched to evaluate the damage. The medical center discovered the breach March 4, had the Web site removed from the Internet, and fired the vendor and its subcontractors.

15. April 29, WFMZ 69 Allentown – (Pennsylvania) Patients' medical billing records missing for 2 years. Reading Health System notified former patients of Western Berks Internal Medicine April 29 that 3 boxes, containing 1,845 medical billing records were taken from the Spring Township practice in March 2012 and returned March 24, 2014. Authorities are investigating after the health system was notified when a maintenance service vendor told hospital officials he found the boxes at the practice's former office and took them home.

24. *April 30, KNBC 4 Los Angeles* – (California) **Workers sickened by chemical odor.** Authorities stated that 300 people were evacuated from a Verizon office building in Pomona April 29 after a chemical smell spread through the building. Five people were hospitalized after coming in contact with an adhesive remover in a construction area on the building's third floor that was the source of the smell.

26. April 30, Reuters – (National) Flooding batters U.S. Southeast reeling from deadly tornadoes. At least 34 people have died during a tornado-producing storm system that moved through several southern States, prompting more than 100 commercial properties and 2,000 homes to report damage. Some Florida Panhandle school districts were closed April 30 due to the storms, while State officials urged motorists to stay off the roadways due to flooding, damaged roads, and storm debris.
