### Top Stories

- Crews were called May 4 after a train hit a piece of metal on the rail tracks in the Town of Waterford, Wisconsin, causing about 4,000 gallons of fuel to spill, of which 2,400 gallons soaked into the ground while crews cleaned up the remainder. – *WTMJ 4 Milwaukee* (See item [9](#))
- Heavy rainfall April 30 overwhelmed Stamford's sewage treatment plant's disinfection system in Connecticut, causing about 25 million gallons of partially-treated sewage to spill into the East Branch of Stamford Harbor May 1. – *Stamford Advocate* (See item [18](#))
- Fire crews reached 75 percent containment May 5 of a wildfire that burned about 3,500 acres in Logan County, Oklahoma. Several homes were destroyed and one man was killed while 1,000 residents were voluntarily evacuated. – *KFOR 4 Oklahoma City* (See item [20](#))

Operators were working to determine the cause of the shutdown before returning the reactor to operation.

2. *May 3, CNNMoney* – (National) **GM recalls SUVs for inaccurate fuel gauges.** General Motors announced a recall May 3 affecting 51,640 model year 2014 Buick Enclave, Chevrolet Traverse, and GMC Acadia vehicles due to a software issue that could cause the vehicles' fuel gauges to malfunction and display inaccurate fuel levels.

The company was fined \$89,000 for the violations.

Worth PD looking for ‘Wig Bandit’ bank robbery suspect.** Fort Worth police requested the public’s help in identifying a suspect known as the “Wig Bandit” responsible for four bank robberies in the area beginning in January. The suspect was most recently linked to the robberies of a Comerica Bank branch and a Woodhaven Bank branch which took place May 1.

6. *May 5, Philadelphia Inquirer* – (Pennsylvania) **Turbulence injures six on flight from Philadelphia to Florida.** A U.S. Airways Orlando-bound flight departing from Philadelphia International Airport was forced to return to Philadelphia May 4 after hitting severe turbulence at about 17,000 feet, causing injuries to 4 passengers and 2 flight attendants.

8. *May 5, KOCO 5 Oklahoma City* – (Oklahoma) **U.S. Highway 270 remains closed near Seiling after large wildfire.** A portion of U.S. Highway 270 was closed near Seiling, Oklahoma, for several hours May 4-5 due to wildfires that caused downed power lines and transformers to block the roadway, as well as smoke that caused low visibility.

13. *May 4, KSFY 13 Sioux Falls* – (South Dakota) **Hundreds of hogs killed in Pierre barn fire.** Hundreds of hogs were killed in a May 4 fire at a Christensen Farms-owned barn near Pierre, South Dakota, that destroyed half of the facility. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

14. *May 3, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Kansas; Indiana; Iowa) **Blue Bunny Premium Bordeaux Cherry Chocolate Ice Cream recalled for undeclared allergen.** Wells Enterprises, Inc., producer of Blue Bunny ice cream, issued a recall May 3 of its Blue Bunny Premium Bordeaux Cherry Chocolate Ice Cream in 56 fluid ounce packages due to undeclared egg. The product was sold at stores in Kansas, Indiana, and Iowa.

15. *May 3, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **Missouri firm recalls Curry Chicken Salad for possible Listeria contamination.** The Food Safety and Inspection Service announced May 3 that Schnucks Kitchen recalled approximately 130 pounds of its Curry White Meat Chicken Salad due to possible Listeria monocytogenes contamination. The product was sent to Schnucks retail grocery locations for deli distribution in 5 states.

16. *May 2, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (International) **Anhing Corporation announces a voluntary recall of Chili Powder due to possible health risk.** Los Angeles-based Anhing Corporation issued a nationwide recall May 2 for 8-ounce packages of its Caravelle Brand Chili Powder, a product of Thailand, due to possible Salmonella contamination. The recall was initiated as a result of a routine sampling program in Maryland.

The university removed the database from the server and is investigating the incident.

27. *May 5, Softpedia* – (International) **“Covert redirect” OAuth security flaw not as serious as it sounds, experts say.** A researcher reported finding a vulnerability dubbed “covert redirect” in OAuth and OpenID that could allow an attacker to access users’ information. However, security researchers found that the vulnerability is only in certain implementations of OAuth and requires both user interaction and an open redirect to be present in a targeted application to be effective.

28. *May 4, Providence Journal* – (Rhode Island) **9 performers in critical condition after fall during circus act in Providence.** An accident during an aerial act injured nine performers during the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus performance at the Dunkin Donuts Center in Providence May 4, causing the cancellation of two other performances. Officials believe a metal-frame apparatus used during an act came free from the metal truss it was connected to, triggering the performers to fall to the ground.
