- MarkWest Energy Partners' natural gas refinery in Washington County, Pennsylvania, remained closed after a May 28 lightning strike and fire prompted the evacuation of nearby residents when an unknown substance began to leak into the air. *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette* (See item 3)

1. *May 29, New Orleans Advocate* – (Louisiana) **Oil refinery in Garyville hit by tornado, officials say.** Marathon Petroleum reported May 28 that a crude unit at its refinery in Garyville will remain shut down until repairs are made to the cooling tower after a tornado struck and damaged the tower. Authorities continued to investigate and assess the total damage.

- 2. *May* 29, *Columbus Dispatch* (Illinois; Ohio) **Generator shut at troubled Prairie State power plant.** Prairie State Energy Campus announced May 28 that one of two generating units at its southern Illinois power plant which serves several communities in Ohio was offline after a water-storage tank overflowed May 24 and released steam and water, creating a hole in the plant's siding and damaging equipment. The unit is under repair and is scheduled to be back online producing power.

- 3. *May 28, Pittsburgh Post-Gazette* (Pennsylvania) **Homes evacuated after leak at Washington County gas plant.** MarkWest Energy Partners reported a lightning strike and fire at its natural gas refinery in Washington County, Pennsylvania, May 28, prompting the evacuation of dozens of residents for more than 3 hours when an unknown substance began to leak into the air, creating a plume over the plant. The plant remains closed until inspections are completed.

- 4. *May* 28, *Sheridan Press; Casper Star-Tribune* (Wyoming) **Officials: Oil spill in Powder River Basin won't affect water supply.** The Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality issued a burn permit for the cleanup of approximately 600 barrels of crude oil that spilled in the Powder River Basin the week of May 19 after a leak in a Belle Fourche Pipeline-owned pipeline in Johnson County. Officials assured the public that the accident did not create a public health hazard, and that the region's water supply was not affected.

5. May 29, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission – (National) Sunbeam recalls Holmes Ceramic Heaters due to fire hazard. Sunbeam Products announced a recall May 29 of around 151,600 Holmes Ceramic Heaters due to their potential to overheat, posing a fire hazard. The company has received 132 reports of units that overheated or stopped working.

6. May 28, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission – (National) Lithonia Lighting recalls emergency lights due to fire hazard. Lithonia Lighting recalled around 1.7 million Quantum ELM and ELM 2 two-light emergency lighting fixtures May 28 due to an issue that can cause the fixtures' circuit boards to overheat, melt the fixtures, and catch fire.

7. *May* 28, *Truckinginfo.com* – (National) **CNG vehicles affected by fuel tank pressure relief valve recall.** Circor, which does business as Circle Seal Controls, announced a recall of over 67,000 pressure release valves for use on compressed natural gas fuel tanks due to O-rings that could fail when exposed to cold temperatures, creating the risk of a gas leak and fire or explosion.

8. *May 29, Chicago Tribune* – (Illinois) **Local investor in alleged Ponzi scheme to face criminal charges.** The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission charged the

Chicago-based owner of Blue Horizon Asset Management LLC and Caldera Advisors LLC May 28 with allegedly running a Ponzi scheme that defrauded at least 35 investors out of over \$11.4 million.

9. *May* 28, *Bloomberg News* – (California) **Ex-fund analyst pleads guilty to insider scheme.** A former analyst at a San Francisco-based hedge fund charged with taking part in a \$27 million insider trading scheme involving nonpublic information ahead of Foundry Network's acquisition of Brocade Communications Systems pleaded guilty May 28 to passing on insider information.

10. *May* 28, *WPVI* 6 *Philadelphia* – (Pennsylvania) **Dozens charged in Philly insurance scheme.** The owner of American Collision and Car One Rental in Philadelphia was charged along with 26 others for allegedly operating a \$5 million insurance fraud scheme that submitted fraudulent vehicle accident claims.

11. *May* 28, *WCBS* 2 *New York City* – (New York) **FBI: 'Gatsby Bandit' sought in series of Queens bank robberies.** The FBI asked the public for information relating to a suspect known as the "Gatsby Bandit" believed to be connected to the robberies of three banks in the Queens area of New York City. The most recent robbery linked to the suspect took place at an Astoria Federal Savings Bank May 16.

13. *May* 28, *KCNC* 4 *Denver* – (Colorado) **Rock slide covers Highway 6, closes Loveland Pass.** Colorado authorities shut down Highway 6/Loveland Pass May 27 indefinitely after a rock slide piled about 7 feet of mud, rocks, and debris on the highway between Arapahoe Basin and Keystone Resort.

14. *May* 28, *Phoenix Arizona Republic* – (Arizona) **Border Patrol agent dies in I-10 crash near Benson.** All eastbound lanes of Interstate 10 near Benson were estimated to fully reopen more than 6 hours after closing due to a single-vehicle accident that left one U.S. Border Patrol agent dead and a second agent injured May 28. The cause of the accident is under investigation.

15. *May* 29, *WALB* 10 *Albany* – (Georgia) **Workers hospitalized after chemical accident at plant.** Employees at a vegetable plant near Rebecca, Georgia, were hospitalized after an employee put acid reducer into a bucket that was unknowingly filled with chlorine, causing a chemical reaction that sickened several workers. A total of 19 workers were decontaminated after exposure to the chlorine gas.

16. May 28, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency – (Pennsylvania) EPA settlement with Lancaster meat processor protects local waters. Kunzler & Company Inc., entered into a settlement with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and agreed to pay a \$40,000 penalty May 28 to settle allegations that the company failed to properly pretreat industrial waste at its meat processing plant in Lancaster before discharging it into the city's wastewater treatment plant.

17. *May 28, Charlotte Observer* – (North Carolina) **Tyson fined \$305,000 for chicken sludge spill.** Tyson Food's Tyson Farms entered into an agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and agreed to pay a fine of \$305,000 for a January 2010 spill of about 210,000 gallons of dissolved air flotation sludge (DAF) from an above-ground storage tank at River Valley Animal Farms in Harmony into a tributary of the South Yadkin River. The spill was caused by a frozen valve that burst at the containment facility, and officials reported that there was no health risk to residents who relied on the water.

18. *May 28, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Rome Packing Co., Inc. recalls minced crab meat because of possible health risk.** Rome Packing Co., Inc., issued a voluntary recall May 28 of Ocean's Catch branded minced crab meat due to possible Listeria monocytogenes contamination. The products were sold in 6-, 8-, and

16-ounce plastic containers and distributed to retail stores nationwide, including Shaws Supermarkets, Market Basket, and Dave's Market.

19. *May 28, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Navitas Naturals issues voluntary recall for Organic Sprouted Chia Seed Powder products.** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration announced May 28 that Navitas Naturals, the Superfood Company voluntarily recalled its products that contain Organic Sprouted Chia Powder due to possible Salmonella contamination.

20. *May* 28, *Fond du Lac Reporter* – (Wisconsin) **Manure spill kills fish in Fond du Lac County's Pipe Creek.** Breeze Dairy Group's Lake Breeze Dairy reported that an estimated 50,000 gallons of manure spilled from its dairy operation in Fond du Lac County May 26, which leaked into Pipe Creek, killing fish and contaminated portions of Camp Shaginappi park.

21. *May* 27, *Associated Press* – (Iowa) **Judge fines cattleman \$12,000 for water pollution.** The owner of Lone Tree Feedlot near Inwood, Iowa, agreed to pay a \$12,000 fine for improperly applying manure on fields that flowed into a tributary of a local creek after a June 2012 inspection by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources revealed that the discharges were not reported in 2009, 2010, or three times in 2011. Mill and Dividing creeks remained closed due to the spill caused by an overflow at the pump station.

30. *May 29, The Register* – (International) **Spy platform zero day exposes cops'** wiretapped calls. Researchers at SEC Consult Vulnerability Lab disclosed nine flaws in NICE Recording eXpress voice recording products marketed to law enforcement organizations that include a root backdoor and remote unauthenticated access to intercepted voice recordings. The vulnerabilities were initially reported to NICE 6 months ago, and the company stated that it would have patches released shortly for five issues that remain unpatched.

31. *May* 28, *Threatpost* – (International) **Siemens fixes DoS flaw in Rugged OS devices.**Siemens issued patches to address a denial of service (DoS) vulnerability in some of its devices that run its Rugged Operating System, which could allow an attacker to crash Rugged OS by sending specially-crafted packets to the devices' Web interface.

Affected devices running Rugged OS are used in several industries, including energy, transportation, and healthcare.

32. *May 29, WABC 7 New York City* – (New York) **Driver charged after crash into Yonkers building prompts evacuations.** Several people were evacuated from a Yonkers building that houses apartments and the Rivers Edge Restaurant after a suspect crashed a vehicle into the first-floor restaurant May 29, damaging the structure's exterior and gas line. The restaurant was closed indefinitely, and residents of the apartments will be allowed to return after the gas main is checked and power is restored.

The backpack held some of the same chemicals used for the bottle bombs.

Arson officials are investigating after at least one person was injured at the Smith Homes apartment complex May 28 when a suspect threw a Molotov cocktail into an occupied apartment unit, causing a small fire when it bounced off the building and landed.

Fire investigators stated May 27 that an explosion at an Indianapolis apartment complex May 15 was deemed accidental and was attributed to an unintentional opening of a gas line inside a townhouse that slowly released gas into its interior until it reached a point of saturation and caused an explosion. Six people were injured in the incident.
