1. *June 15, Minneapolis Star Tribune* – (Minnesota) **Wind-damaged Twin Cities now facing a week of rain.** An estimated 50,000 Xcel Energy customers across the Minneapolis-St. Paul area lost power after a June 14 storm caused high winds, prompting officials to delay flights and ground planes at Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport until winds subsided. Water parks and the annual Juneteenth Twin Cities festival were also closed and cancelled due to the storm.

2. *June 13, Phoenix Arizona Republic* – (Arizona) **Concern widens over sabotage at Nogales power station.** Authorities continue to investigate after Nogales Police determined June 13 that a crude incendiary device placed next to a 50,000 gallon diesel tank at the UniSource Energy Services-owned Valencia Generating Station in Arizona did not explode, only ignited, charring the steel tank June 11.

3. *June 14, Orangeburg Times and Democrat* – (Tennessee) **Eastman operations restored at Kingsport.** Eastman Chemical Company representatives announced June 13 that its Kingsport, Tennessee facility was brought back online and operations were substantially restored following an unplanned outage June 4.

4. *June 14, Charleston Gazette* – (West Virginia) **Freedom proposes runoff control steps in face of DEP orders, water company criticism.** Officials from Freedom Industries proposed June 14 to double its runoff pumping capacity and indefinitely post contractors at its chemical facility in Charleston, West Virginia, after regulators ordered the company to fix a storm water collection trench that overflowed into the Elk River June 12 and 13. Water company officials reported that 6 samples taken after the overflow yielded no detection of hazardous chemicals after the company closed 2 pumps for 3 hours as a precaution.

5. *June 13, Atlanta Journal-Constitution* – (Georgia) **Marietta chemical plant fire losses top \$20 million.** A report released by fire officials stated that total losses from a series of explosions and a fire that tore through an Amrep chemical warehouse in Marietta, Georgia, May 23 were estimated at \$20.5 million and leaks were found May 24 coming from two large tanks at the site. One worker was injured in the incident, and employees were safely evacuated from the plant.

6. *June 15, Reuters* – (National) **U.S. orders mandatory inspections for F-35s after engine issue.** A representative for the Pentagon's F-35 program office stated that the U.S. military ordered mandatory inspections of all Lockheed Martin F-35 fighter aircraft June 13 following an in-flight emergency with a Marine Corps F-35B June 10 in Yuma, Arizona. Inspections focused on the oil flow management valve in the aircrafts' engines, and majority of the fleet's 97 aircraft were inspected and cleared to resume flights June 16.

7. *June 16, Threatpost* – (International) **Dyreza banker trojan seen bypassing SSL.** Researchers identified a new banking trojan known as Dyre or Dyreza that uses browser hooking to intercept traffic moving between victims' systems and their intended Web site, allowing attackers to bypass SSL protections and redirect traffic through the attackers' servers. Researchers at CSIS Group found that the trojan is spread through spam messages and then contacts command and control servers, some of which are located in Latvia.

8. *June 16, Financial Industry Regulatory Authority* – (National) **FINRA fines Merrill Lynch \$8 million; over \$89 million repaid to retirement accounts and charities overcharged for mutual funds.** The Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA)

stated June 16 that it fined Merrill Lynch \$8 million for the company's failure to waive mutual fund sales charges for some retirement accounts and charities, and ordered the company to pay \$24.4 million in restitutions. Merrill Lynch previously repaid another \$64.8 million to investors who were overcharged.

9. *June 14, Krebs on Security* – (National) **P.F. Chang's confirms credit card breach.** P.F. Chang's Chinese Bistro stated June 14 that it had confirmed that it was the victim of a customer payment card data breach affecting an unknown number of customers. The company stated that it has temporarily switched to manual payment card imprinting to process transactions while the breach continues to be investigated.

10. *June 14, DNAINfo Chicago* – (Illinois) **Man accused of skimming 200 Chase Bank ATM cards: Prosecutors.** A Romanian national was arrested June 12 in Chicago and was charged for allegedly placing skimming devices on Chase Bank ATMs in the city's North Side area, resulting in the theft of data from 200 cards.

One of the accused worked in the finance department of Ross Stores headquarters and allegedly passed on insider information to three others in order to trade on the nonpublic information.

12. *June 16, WCAU 10 Philadelphia* – (Pennsylvania) **Jet forced to circle area for hours, return to Philadelphia over landing gear issue.** A Lufthansa jet leaving the Philadelphia International Airport bound for Germany June 15 was forced to circle the Philadelphia airport area for several hours shortly after takeoff to dump fuel in order to lighten the plane's load for landing due to a landing gear malfunction. None of the 269 passengers or crew were harmed

The store closed its deli for several hours June 11 to undergo sanitization and deep cleaning and reopened with the approval of county officials.

21. *June 13, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Schnucks Bakery recalls Devil's Food Cakes topped with undeclared pecans.** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration announced June 13 that Schnucks Bakery issued a voluntary recall for two variations of its Devil's Food Cakes decorated with pecans due to undeclared nuts. The products were sold at all Schnucks stores Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, and Wisconsin.

22. *June 13, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **Illinois firm recalls turkey base product due to misbranding and undeclared allergen.** The Food Safety and Inspection Service announced June 13 that Illinois-based Vanee Foods issued a recall for approximately 3,156 pounds of Imperial Sysco Turkey Base because the products were misbranded as chicken base and contain undeclared milk. The product was produced March 19 and sold in cases of 6, 1 pound containers that were distributed to food distribution centers in several States.

23. *June 12, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Connecticut; New Jersey; New York) **La Finquita Cheese issues an allergy alert due to potential peanut and tree nut contamination in Fresh Farmers Cheese.** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration announced June 12 that La Finquita, LLC issued a recall for one lot of its 14.11 ounce containers of La Finquita Quesito Fresco Campesino Fresh Farmer's Cheese due to the possibility it may be adulterated with peanut and tree nut allergens. The recall was initiated after a supplier for the product notified La Finquita that milk used during the manufacturing process may be contaminated with peanuts and pistachios.

24. *June 15, Des Moines Register* – (Iowa) **Most Iowa water utilities dump nitrates in rivers.** Water authorities in Des Moines and the operators of most of Iowa's other nitrate removal systems stated that their facilities release nitrates removed during water treatment back into waterways, causing downstream facilities to have to remove the nitrates again. The practice is legal and often done because of the size and cost of systems that can reprocess the nitrates into useable fertilizers.

One suspect attempted to purchase up to 20 sensors for research projects while working as a graduate research assistant at the Iowa State University while the other suspect was caught attempting to board a flight to China hiding a sensor in computer speaker.

34. *June 16, Softpedia* – (International) **NAS boxes "pwned" by crypto currency miner.** Researchers with Dell SecureWorks released a report which showed how an attacker was able to utilize vulnerabilities in the DiskStation Manager (DSM) operating system used in Synology network access storage (NAS) devices to plant the CPU Miner crypto currency mining malware. The attacker used the malware to mine over \$600,000 in the Dogecoin crypto currency, though the vulnerabilities were later patched by Synology. 35. *June 13, Threatpost* – (International) **ISC patches critical DoS vulnerability in BIND.** The Internet Systems Consortium (ISC) reported June 11 that a vulnerability exists in some BIND domain name system (DNS) servers that could allow attackers to perform denial of service (DoS) attacks by sending a specially designed query.
