Two people were killed, thousands of customers lost power across several U.S. States, and hundreds of flights were cancelled or delayed at Chicago's O'Hare and Midway airports due to a derecho storm that moved through the Midwest and Plains regions June 30. A piece of equipment that dries corn exploded at an Arkalon Energy, LLC ethanol plant in Liberal, Kansas, June 29, potentially causing over \$1 million in damages. Fire crews worked through June 30 putting out fires and investigators believe the explosion may have been caused by a natural gas explosion in the combustion chamber of the dryer. - 5. June 30, U.S. Department of Justice (International) BNP Paribas agrees to plead guilty and to pay \$8.9 billion for illegally processing financial transactions for countries subject to U.S. economic sanctions. France-based financial institution BNP Paribas agreed in court documents June 30 to enter a guilty plea for conspiring to violate U.S. sanctions by processing billions of dollars of transactions for Cuban, Iranian, and Sudanese entities. BNP Paribas also agreed to pay \$8.9 billion in penalties. Police believe a man arrested in Kenton County, Kentucky, June 25 is responsible for at least four bank robberies in Kentucky and one in Indiana. Authorities are continuing to investigate and believe the man may be connected with robberies in five cities.

8. *July 1, Associated Press* – (International) **Delta jet returns to Jamaica after fluid leak.** An Atlanta-bound Delta Airlines flight returned to an airport in Jamaica shortly after take-off June 30 when its No. 2 engine experienced a pneumatic leak causing smoke to trail from the aircraft. The plane landed safely and all 154 passengers and crew members were put on a new flight.

11. June 30, Reuters – (National) U.S. Army Corps to close upper Mississippi as waters rise. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers announced that rising flood waters on the Mississippi River were expected to make 11 locks and dams impassible and force the closure of the river June 30 between Bellevue, Iowa, to Saverton, Missouri. Around 80 barge tows were expected to be affected by the closure.

15. June 30, U.S. Department of Labor – (Texas) San Antonio fruit processor and staffing agency cited by US Department of Labor's OSHA for exposing temporary workers to serious hazards. Fresh From Texas Inc., was cited by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration for 17 workplace safety violations following a December 2013 inspection of the fruit processor's San Antonio facility. Proposed penalties total \$135,200.

16. *June 30*, *WXXA 23 Albany* – (New York) **Boil water advisory after overnight water main break in Rotterdam.** A June 30 water main break in Rotterdam prompted the Schenectady County Department of Environmental Health to issue a boil water advisory for the entire town as a precautionary measure while crews worked to fix the break.

Classes were cancelled June 30 at Canutillo High School and El Paso Community College's Northwest campus in Texas due to a June 29 water main break. - 20. *June 30, Time Warner Cable News* (New York) **Minnewaska Beach temporarily closed because of high population of leeches.** A high population of leeches led to the closure of Minnewaska Lake in Minnewaska State Park June 30 after workers discovered the leeches while setting up a floating dock. The Kerhonkson, New York lake is undergoing a copper sulfate treatment and officials are monitoring the water in order to reopen the beach by July 4.

The issue was resolved 6 hours after city technology worker and Verizon crews identified and fixed the problem.

No-IP stated that the Microsoft takeover and rerouting of

traffic through sinkholes has also disrupted legitimate customers' service.

WLWT-TV 5 Cincinnati and its sister station MeTV, resumed full-power broadcasts June 30 after going off-air June 26 due to a faulty transmission line on its Chickasaw Street tower in Fairview Heights. About 15 percent of viewers who use an antenna were impacted by the outage.
