- Part of the northbound 215 Freeway in Perris, California, was closed July 15 and expected to be closed into July 16 after a semi-truck hit a bridge at the interchange with State Route 74, causing a partial collapse of the bridge. – *KTLA 5 Los Angeles* (See item [13](#))

1. *July 16, Batavia Daily News* – (New York) **Perry man dies from injuries suffered during burglary attempt at NYSEG substation.** The New York State Electric and Gas Corporation substation in Perry suffered nearly \$100,000 in damages and continued repairs July 15 after two men attempted to burglarize the substation July 10. One man died from injuries sustained during the incident while the other was arrested and charged.

2. *July 15, San Antonio Business Journal* – (Texas) **State of Texas spent \$14.3 million plugging and cleaning up abandoned oil wells.** The Texas Railroad Commission, overseeing oil and gas activity in the State, plugged 428 abandoned wells and conducted 117 site remediation and cleanup projects in its current fiscal year ending August 31, spending \$14.3 million.

3. *July 15, Associated Press* – (West Virginia) **Tank demolition starts at chemical spill site.** West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection officials stated that a contractor started the demolition process July 15 by cutting 10 steel storage tanks at Freedom Industries' Charleston facility, the site of a January 9 chemical spill that contaminated the water supply of 300,000 individuals. Demolition was delayed several times due to various issues, including asbestos concerns, but officials stated work should be complete in 2 to 4 weeks.

4. *July 15, Columbia The State* – (South Carolina) **Leak sparks shutdown of SC nuclear power plant.** The V.C. Summer nuclear power plant in Fairfield County, South Carolina, was shut down July 15 after its operators found water leaking from a pressurizer safety valve. The plant was expected to be offline for up to 14 days in order to repair the leak and restart the reactor.

5. *July 16, Associated Press* – (International) **BMW recalls 1.6M 3-Series cars for air bag problem.** BMW announced that it is recalling 1.6 million model year 2000-2006 3-Series vehicles, including 574,000 in the U.S., due to faulty airbag inflators manufactured by Takata. The airbag inflators could rupture during deployment and create shrapnel.

6. *July 15, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Illinois) **US Department of Labor OSHA violations issued for repeatedly exposing workers to amputation hazards at Illinois storage system manufacturer.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Interlake Mecalux Inc., with two repeat and two serious violations at the company's Pontiac, Illinois facility for exposing workers to amputation hazards. Proposed fines totaled \$47,520 and were the second set of citations issued to the company in 2014.

7. *July 16, Pacific News Center* – (Guam) **All Bank of Guam branches evacuated for a few hours this morning following bomb threat.** All branches of the Bank of Guam were evacuated for over an hour July 16 after a bomb threat was phoned in. No explosive devices were found, and the threats followed bomb threats targeting court buildings on the island the week of July 7.

8. *July 15, Wilmington News Journal* – (Delaware) **Ex-Wilmington Trust loan exec indicted for fraud.** A former Wilmington Trust lender was indicted July 15 for

allegedly engaging in a self-dealing arrangement with a Delaware home builder, using his position at the bank to authorize over \$50 million in draws on existing loans to the builder and over \$15 million in new loans.

9. *July 15, WHIO 7 Dayton* – (Ohio) **FBI offering reward for 'Buckeye Bandit' bank robber.** The FBI offered a reward for information relating to a suspect known as the "Buckeye Bandit", believed to be responsible for at least 16 bank robberies in the Columbus area, as well as 3 robberies at a pharmacy. The most recent bank robbery linked to the suspect occurred July 9 at a SMART Federal Credit Union branch in Columbus.

11. *July 16, Lihue Garden Island* – (Hawaii) **Chemical spill closes Kuhio Highway.** A tie-down strap on a semi-truck carrying hypochlorite solution for BEI Hawaii broke and at least 330 gallons of the water treatment agent spilled from 2 containers onto and along the Kuhio Highway in Kapaia July 16. The roadway was closed for about 2 hours while HAZMAT crews contained and neutralized the spill.

12. *July 16, Associated Press* – (Georgia) **Casino boat with 123 people aboard stuck on rocks.** The Escapade, a casino boat with 96 passengers and 27 crewmembers was stranded for several hours July 15-16 when it ran aground on rocks near Tybee Island. No injuries were reported and Coast Guard crews were awaiting high tide to tow the ship or remove the passengers from the ship.

13. *July 15, KTLA 5 Los Angeles* – (California) **Traffic snarled after big rig crash causes bridge collapse on 215 freeway.** Part of the northbound 215 Freeway in Perris was closed July 15 and expected to be closed into July 16 after a semi-truck hit a bridge at the interchange with State Route 74, causing a partial collapse of the bridge. Southbound lanes were also closed for a time during the repair work.

14. *July 15, Los Angeles Times* – (California) **91 Freeway shooting in Anaheim: Father killed, motive unknown.** A portion of the westbound 91 Freeway in Anaheim was closed for several hours July 15 due to a shooting that killed one individual as authorities investigated the road for evidence. The victim was driving while he was shot and police were continuing to investigate.

16. *July 15, KHBS 40 Fort Smith/KHOG 29 Fayetteville* – (Arkansas) **Restaurant linked to shigella outbreak ready to reopen.** Officials at the Walmart in Bentonville notified employees that Salsarita's, a restaurant operated by Eurest and located inside the Walmart Home Office Cafe, will reopen July 16 following a shigella outbreak that sickened 275 people and spread to 9 States. Benton County health officials reported that no violations were found in the kitchen while company officials stated that Eurest will hire a quality assurance manager and retrain staff on safety protocols.

17. *July 15, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency* – (Georgia) **Zep Inc. pays \$905,000 for alleged violations of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act.** The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency announced July 15 that Zep Inc., agreed to pay \$905,000 to resolve allegations that the Atlanta-based company failed to comply with federal regulations, including the requirement to obtain a supplemental distribution agreement during the sale and distribution of the unregistered and misbranded pesticide, "Formula 165." Zep Inc., has since obtained the necessary certifications required under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act.

The new regulation will begin to take place in early August.

20. *July 16, Lafayette Daily Advertiser* – (Louisiana) **Search continues for possible explosives on UL campus.** The University of Louisiana at Lafayette evacuated its campus and cancelled all classes and events July 16 due to a bomb threat that was called into a local news station. Police conducted a search of the campus and found two suspicious devices, while residents were taken off-campus and two nearby businesses were also evacuated.

21. *July 16, WTVT 13 Tampa* – (Florida) **Investigation continues after Largo hazmat scare.** Authorities are investigating after the Mary Grizzle State Office Building in Largo, Florida, was evacuated July 15 when a substance caused respiratory issues for eight people. Firefighters shut off the air conditioning while three of the sickened individuals were sent to area hospitals and the remaining five were treated onsite.

The 20 vulnerabilities in Java can all be remotely exploited without authentication and users were advised to apply the updates as soon as possible. 27. *July 16, Softpedia* – (International) **vBulletin exploitable through SQL injection.** Members of the Romanian Security Team group identified and reported an SQL injection vulnerability in vBulletin which could be used by attackers to gain access to a forum's administration panel and databases. The group reported the vulnerability to the developers of vBulletin and stated that they would disclose the full details of the issue once a fix is released.

28. *July 16, Securityweek* – (International) **OpenBSD downplays PRNG vulnerability in LibreSSL.** A researcher with Opsmate reported finding a flaw in the pseudorandom number generator (PRNG) in LibreSSL for Linux. Representatives of the OpenBSD Project confirmed that the issue exists but stated that the now-fixed problem was unlikely to be exploitable in real world conditions.
