1. August 10, KOKH 25 Oklahoma City – (Oklahoma) Power restored in MWC and Harrah following car crash. Over 23,000 Oklahoma Gas & Electric customers in the Oklahoma City metro area were without power for 2 hours August 10 after a car crashed into transmissions lines in Midwest City.

2. August 8, Los Angeles Times – (Hawaii) Iselle hits Hawaii: Heavy rain damages homes; roads blocked. About 21,000 customers lost power August 8 due to Tropical Storm Iselle, which caused heavy rains and strong winds prompting the closure of several roads and highways on the Big Island and Maui, as well as the cancellation of flights into and out of the island. Public schools, universities, beach parks, and national parks were closed while all Hawaii State government offices were closed through August 11.

3. August 11, WJHL 11 Johnson City – (Tennessee) Explosion at Eastman Chem. research facility; no workers seriously injured. Authorities are investigating an August 10 explosion that blew out windows and doors inside a research facility located at an Eastman Chemical Company facility in Kingsport. One worker was transported to an area hospital and two additional individuals received treatment at an on-site medical facility.

The #1 Unit Compressor Building at a BP Chemical Company plant in Huger was taken offline and the compressor was isolated August 9 due to a fire inside the structure. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

Nuclear Reactors, Materials, and Waste Sector

5. August 8, Baltimore Sun – (Maryland) Calvert Cliffs nuclear plant cited for safety issue. The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission cited the operators of the Calvert Cliffs nuclear power plant in Lusby August 8 for a low-to-moderate safety issue due to improperly set radiation monitors that would trigger an alarm at radiation levels 100

times lower than would present a threat, creating the potential for plant staff to overreact and take unwarranted emergency measures.

6. August 11, Occupational Health & Safety – (National) Hyundai paying \$17.35 million civil penalty in brake corrosion case. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) announced August 7 that Hyundai agreed to pay a \$17.35 million civil penalty and comply with NHTSA oversight requirements for failing to report in a timely manner a safety-related defect affecting model year 2009-2012 Genesis vehicles. The NHTSA determined that Hyundai in 2012 was aware of a brake fluid corrosion issue but instead of recalling the vehicles, the company instructed dealerships to change the unsuitable brake fluid Source: http://ohsonline.com/articles/2014/08/11/hyundai-paying-civil-penalty.aspx?admgarea=news

7. August 10, USA Today – (National) VW recalls about 150,000 SUVs for stalling. Volkswagen announced a recall August 9 for 151,389 model year 2009-2014 Tiguan vehicles due to the potential for fuel bubbles to develop when winter fuel blends are used in warmer conditions or when the vehicle is restarted shortly after it was in operation, creating the potential for the vehicle to stall. The issue will be addressed by updating the vehicles' software to prevent the issue.

August 8, WXYZ 7 Detroit – (National) **GM announces 5 recalls covering almost 270,000 vehicles Friday afternoon.** General Motors announced five recalls August 8 covering around 270,000 vehicles from model years between 2002 and 2015. The largest recall involved over 200,000 model year 2002-2004 Saturn Vue vehicles due to the potential for the vehicle's key to be removed from the ignition while not in the 'off' position.

Police in Brea arrested an Anaheim man believed to be the "Quad Bandit" August 7, a suspect linked to 10 bank robberies in Los Angeles and Orange counties. The suspect was arrested following the robbery of a Bank of the West branch in Brea.

10. August 8, U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission – (International) SEC charges Bahamas-based brokerage firm and president with facilitating fraudulent scheme by hedge fund manager. The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission announced charges August 8 against Bahamas-based Alliance Investment Management Limited (AIM) and its president for allegedly working with a man charged with defrauding investors in order to misrepresent the assets and performance of the man's investment scheme. AIM and its president allegedly allowed the man to misappropriate at least \$45 million in investor funds and received over \$5 million in return for their assistance. Source:

August 8, U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission – (National) SEC obtains final judgments against all defendants and relief defendants, securing permanent injunctions and nearly \$70 million in disgorgement, prejudgment interest, and civil penalties. The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission obtained final judgments August 1 against AIC Inc., Community Bankers Securities LLC, and their founder and CEO, as well as against several relief defendants, ordering them to pay almost \$70 million in disgorgement and other penalties for running an offering fraud scheme that operated between 2006 and 2009 and defrauded investors in several States. - 12. August 11, WABC 7 New York City; Associated Press (Puerto Rico) JetBlue says evacuated flight from Puerto Rico experienced bird strike. A JetBlue flight headed to New York City from San Juan, Puerto Rico, aborted takeoff after its left engine caught fire due to a bird strike August 9. The 186 passengers aboard were evacuated and 3 people suffered minor injuries from the emergency evacuation.

- 13. August 11, Salem News; Associated Press (Massachusetts) Fire on Emirates plane

put out at Boston. An engine on an Emirates flight from Dubai caught fire prior to landing at Logan International Airport in Boston August 10, prompting crews to put out the fire when the plane landed. There were no reported injuries among the 367 passengers and crew members on the flight.

August 10, WCSC 5 Charleston (South Carolina) NCPD: 6 train cars derail on Rivers Ave. Six train cars from a CSX train derailed in North Charleston August 9, prompting roadway and rail closures. Crews were expected to arrive at the scene to assist in getting the cars back onto the tracks after several of them rolled onto their side. - 15. August 9, Atlanta Journal-Constitution (Georgia) MARTA's Ashby station reopened after stabbing investigation. The Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority's Ashby station in Atlanta reopened both eastbound and westbound traffic August 9 after closing for nearly 5 hours while authorities investigated a stabbing following a fight inside the station. One person was injured and transported to an area hospital and authorities took a second individual into custody.

 Leacock County farm after the skid loader that he was operating overturned into the 4foot deep pit and he was unable to escape due to a safety belt that would not release.

chemicals onto South College Street in Salem, Illinois. Authorities reported that the spill posed no human health risks, and the roadway was closed for 6 hours while crews cleaned the scene.

27. August 11, Help Net Security – (International) Critical 0-days found in CPE WAN Management Protocol. Check Point researchers reported finding several zero-day vulnerabilities in CPE WAN Management Protocol (CWMP/TR-069) deployments

used by major Internet service providers (ISPs) to control home and business Internet equipment which could allow large-scale malware infections able to compromise privacy, steal information, or cause service disruptions. Check Point reported the vulnerabilities to ISPs and assisted in closing them before reporting their findings publicly.

28. August 11, Help Net Security – (International) Smart Nest thermostat easily turned into spying device. An independent researcher and two researchers from the University of Central Florida presenting at the 2014 Black Hat conference demonstrated how Nest smart thermostats can be compromised quickly using a USB flash drive, potentially allowing attackers to obtain information on a victim's habits as well as network information such as WiFi credentials. Compromised thermostats could also be used to connect to the Internet and be used in a variety of malicious tasks.

29. August 9, Softpedia – (International) 10,000 impacted by resurging Facebook color changing app scam. Researchers at Cheetah Mobile reported that a resurgence of a scam that purports to change the color scheme of Facebook has affected 10,000 users recently. The campaign steals users' Access Tokens and then attempts to install a malicious fake antivirus program or video player.

Investigators believe the improper use of an insecticide fogger was the cause of an explosion and fire at a Hollywood apartment building August 11. - 32. August 10, Washington Post (Maryland) Firefighters rescue 24 on roller coaster at Six Flags. Firefighters used a tower ladder to remove fencing and rescue 24 riders that were stranded 75 feet in the air for up to 5 hours after the Joker's Jinx roller coaster malfunctioned at the Six Flags America amusement park in Marlboro August 10. The section of the park near the ride was closed indefinitely while authorities investigate the cause of the incident and inspect the ride.
