Top Stories

- The North Dakota Department of Health announced that about 1,000 barrels of brine spilled from a corroded pipeline at an Oasis-owned well site in McKenzie County October 9. *United Press International* (See item 1)
- Residents in Mahtomedi, Minnesota, were warned to stay out of Lost Lake after approximately 25,000 gallons of raw sewage spilled into the lake October 4 when a force main broke. White Bear Press (See item 14)
- Crews reached full containment October 9 of the 97,000-acre King Fire in the Eldorado National Forest near Sacramento, California. – Los Angeles Times (See item <u>21</u>)
- Dairy Queen representatives reported October 9 that the payment systems for 395 of its stores nationwide were compromised by the Backoff malware, exposing the personal and financial information of less than 600,000 customers. *Bloomberg News* (See item 29)

1. October 10, United Press International – (North Dakota) North Dakota spill reaches waterway. The North Dakota Department of Health announced that about 1,000 barrels of brine spilled from a corroded pipeline at an Oasis-owned well site in McKenzie County October 9. Officials reported that a majority of the water brine was contained to the site and an unknown amount spilled onto adjacent land and into a stream. 2. October 9, U.S. Department of Labor – (Ohio) **OSHA** cites Haverhill Chemicals after fatal injury of an employee clearing reactor drain. Haverhill Chemicals LLC was cited by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) October 9 for 23 workplace safety violations after an employee was killed April 4 while clearing a drain line to a reactor at the company's Haverhill, Ohio facility. The company was fined \$134,000 and placed in OSHA's Severe Violator Enforcement Program.

3. October 9, Wichita Eagle – (Kansas) Deadline extension averts costly shutdown at Wolf Creek nuclear power plant. The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission granted the Wolf Creek nuclear power plant near Burlington, Kansas, an additional 8 hours to finish testing a backup generator October 9 after the generator was damaged in a fire October 6. The repairs were completed October 8 but regulations require that the generator run for 24 hours before it can be certified, which would have gone beyond the normal 72 hour deadline.

Police arrested a Boise woman and a Miami, Florida man at a residence in Boise as part of an investigation into a counterfeit payment card ring linked to the arrest of a Miramar, Florida man in September who allegedly purchased around \$12,000 in gift cards using fake payment cards. 6. October 9, Lower Hudson Valley Journal News – (New York) Route 303N reopens after fuel spill, accident. Northbound lanes of Route 303 in West Nyack were closed for more than 2 hours as crews worked to clean up debris following a 3-vehicle accident that left 5 people injured October 9. A semi-truck crashed into two other vehicles after running a red light, spilling 20 to 30 gallons of diesel fuel across the roadway.

- 7. October 9, WOOD 8 Grand Rapids (Michigan) Ramp reopens after semi flips onto guardrail. A semi-truck hauling potting soil overturned on an exit ramp on westbound Interstate 196 near Grand Rapids October 9, prompting authorities to shut down the ramp for nearly 10 hours as crews worked to extricate the driver and clean up the accident.

- 8. October 9, U.S. Department of Labor (Massachusetts) FedEx Ground Packaging Systems Inc. cited for machine guarding hazard at Wilmington, Massachusetts, distribution center. The Occupational Safety and Health Administration issued one repeat violation to FedEx Ground Packaging System Inc., October 9 after an inspection at its Wilmington, Massachusetts distribution center found an improperly guarded

conveyor belt that exposed employees to potential injuries. Proposed fines totaled \$44,000.

9. October 10, WNAX 570 AM Yankton – (Iowa) Manure spill was accidental. The Iowa Department of Natural Resources is investigating after about 200,000 gallons of liquid manure spilled from a broken pipe on a feedlot near Guthrie Center into David's Creek. Officials are testing the water to determine the level of contamination from the manure discharge.

10. October 9, WTVM 9 Columbus – (Georgia) Buena Vista Tyson plant temporarily closed due to small fire. A Tyson Food Inc. food processing facility in Buena Vista, Georgia, was closed indefinitely October 7 after a feed wire coming into the plant tripped a breaker due to a short, damaging an electrical panel and knocking out power to an area of the building. The plant is expected to reopen after repairs are made to a piece of machinery on the manufacturing line.

- 11. October 9, Washington State Department of Ecology (Washington) Fleischmann's Vinegar faces \$23,000 fine for vinegar spill. The Washington State Department of Ecology issued a \$23,000 fine to Fleischmann's Vinegar for several wastewater violations and after a June incident where approximately 2,000 gallons of concentrated vinegar spilled onto the ground and into two stormwater ponds. The company responded to the incident by constructing containment berms, replacing a submersible pump, and removing contaminated gravel, among other corrections. - 12. October 9, U.S. Food and Drug Administration (International) Allergy alert on undelcared eggs in Lotte Waffles. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration reported October 9 that Lotte Confectionary Co., of Seoul, Korea, issued a recall for 1.41- and 5.64-ounce packages of its Lotte Waffles due to undeclared egg ingredients. The product was distributed to retail stores in several States and Canada.

A boil water advisory was issued to about 90 households in Fort Lauderdale October 9 until further notice after a water main broke, shutting off service for several hours until crews repaired the line.

Authorities redirected the waste water into a new sewer pipe and are monitoring bacteria levels in the lake water.

Researchers at Malware Must Die reported detecting a number of Linux and UNIX systems infected by several IP addresses belonging to the Mayhem botnet. The botnet was found to be pinging Internet-facing systems looking for the Shellshock vulnerability in order to drop a new remote installer written in Perl. Bass & Co. officials reported October 9 that an unauthorized party attached a skimming device to a cash register at one of the company's stores in Orlando, and that the device is believed to have captured the personal information, including name and payment card data, of customers who shopped at the location between about August 13 and September 12.
