Top Stories

- Athena Capital Research in New York agreed to pay \$1 million in penalties to resolve U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission charges that the firm engaged in the manipulation of NASDAQ-listed stocks by placing large numbers of rapid, aggressive trades 2 seconds before the end of trading. U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (See item 4)
- Six crew members and 38 passengers aboard an Arkansas and Missouri Railroad passenger train were injured after a freight train crashed into it while it was stalled on a small grade in northwest Arkansas October 16. *CNN* (See item <u>6</u>)

Energy Sector

1. October 16, KTHV 11 Little Rock – (Arkansas) 2 injured in Entergy substation failure. Entergy is investigating after two employees were injured in a substation failure October 15 after a piece of equipment malfunctioned in Marshall, Arkansas. Preliminary reports determined a regulator failed, de-energizing the substation and causing extensive damage.

2. October 16, New Orleans Times-Picayune – (International) Offshore oil platform owner agrees to \$1 million fine for unauthorized oil, chemical discharges. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, U.S. Department of Justice, and Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement announced October 16 that ATP Infrastructure Partners, LP agreed to pay a \$1 million fine to a settle a federal lawsuit over illegal discharges of oil and dispersants. The portion of the lawsuit against ATP Oil & Gas remains unsolved after the companies partnered together to operate the ATP Innovator platform atop its Gomez well in the Mississippi Canyon, which was found to have a metal tube connected to the wastewater outfall pipe allowing the discharge of the dispersant Cleartron ZB-103.

3. October 16, WNWO 24 Toledo – (Ohio) Truck accident, ammonia spill closes Wood County intersection. A semi-truck carrying ammonia flipped over after it was struck by a vehicle that failed to stop at a stop sign while traveling on Ohio State Route 281 in Portage, causing an unknown amount of the chemical to leak onto the roadway and into a nearby ditch. Homes were evacuated for several hours and the intersection was expected to be closed for several days while crews cleaned the spill and monitored the water supply in the area.

4. October 16, U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission – (New York) SEC charges New York-based high frequency trading firm with fraudulent trading to manipulate closing prices. New York City-based high frequency trading firm Athena Capital Research agreed to pay \$1 million in penalties to resolve U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission charges that the firm engaged in the manipulation of NASDAQ-listed stocks by placing large numbers of rapid, aggressive trades 2 seconds before the end of trading over a 6 month period. The case was the first high frequency trading stock manipulation case.

A Miami broker pleaded guilty October 16 to his role in the \$1.4 billion Ponzi scheme run out of the Rothstein Rosenfeldt Adler law firm in Fort Lauderdale. The broker was charged for assisting in several fraudulent deals that were part of the larger Ponzi scheme

- 6. October 17, CNN (Arkansas) Train collision injures 44 on fall foliage ride in northwest Arkansas. Six crew members and 38 passengers aboard an Arkansas and Missouri Railroad passenger train touring fall foliage were injured after a freight train crashed into it while it was stalled on a small grade in northwest Arkansas October 16. Authorities are investigating the incident.

- 7. October 17, KMOV 4 St. Louis (Missouri) **I-70 reopens after fatal accident.** An accident forced the closure of eastbound lanes of Interstate 70 in St. Charles County for approximately 2 hours October 17 when a pedestrian was struck and killed by a passenger vehicle.

- 8. October 17, Lebanon Valley News (Vermont) Triple truck accidents delay I-91 traffic. A portion of Interstate 91 southbound was closed for nearly 6 hours while crews responded to an accident involving a semi-truck whose driver lost control of the vehicle and drove down into an embankment, crashing into a rock ledge. - 9. October 17, Doylestown Intelligencer (Pennsylvania) Tractor-trailer accident closes turnpike in Bucks for several hours. A portion of westbound Pennsylvania Turnpike was shut down for 3 hours October 16 when a semi-truck jackknifed, struck a bridge, and spilled roughly 100 gallons of diesel fuel into the Neshaminy Creek. Crews cleared the scene and allowed to creek's natural currents to disperse the fuel. - 10. October 16, Camdenton Lake Sun Leader (Missouri) RPD: Suspicious package was meant to steal mail. The Rolla Post Office in Missouri and surrounding businesses were evacuated for roughly 7 hours October 16 while a bomb squad inspected a suspicious package found in a mail receptacle outside the building, which turned out to be a device designed to extract mail from a postal box. Officials cleared the scene and continue to investigate the incident.

11. October 16, Associated Press – (Idaho) Jerome Cheese Co. agrees to \$88K EPA settlement over anhydrous ammonia. Jerome Cheese Company agreed to pay \$88,000 in penalties to resolve allegations by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency that the cheese producer failed to implement appropriate safety policies and record keeping systems for the storage of 10,000 gallons of anhydrous ammonia at the company's facility in Idaho.

12. October 16, U.S. Department of Agriculture – (Massachusetts; New York)

Massachusetts firm recalls chicken products due to possible misbranding and undeclared allergen. The Food Safety and Inspection Service reported October 16 that Shop Packaging LLC initiated a recall for about 115,505 pounds of chicken wing products due to undeclared soy lecithin caused by misbranding. The product was sold in 20-pound bags and shipped to a distribution facility in New York.

13. October 16, Baltimore Sun – (Maryland) Sewage leak at Gwynns Falls takes eight days to repair. The Baltimore County Department of Public Works announced October 16 that an estimated 17,553 gallons of sewage was discharged into Gwynns Falls beginning September 24, and lasted through October 2 before crews were able to repair a broken sewer pipe. Workers made several attempts to plug the leak after determining a tree had fallen on the pipe.

14. October 16, KTVX 4 Salt Lake City – (Utah) Boil advisory lifted for Stansbury Park residents. A boil water advisory was lifted for Stansbury Park residents October 16 after 18 water samples came back negative for coliform bacteria. The advisory went into effect October 14 after the water supply in several homes tested positive for the bacteria.

- 16. October 16, KTLA 5 Los Angeles (California) Man suspected of making threat against Pierce College had assault rifle, handgun: Sheriff's department. Pierce College in Woodland Hills was evacuated for 7 hours October 16 after a threat on social media claimed that an armed gunman may come to the campus. Police arrested a Northridge man on suspicion of making the threat and found an assault rifle, handgun,

and several rounds of ammunition at his home.

A woman from Durham pleaded guilty October 9 to defrauding the federal financial aid program out of \$121,793 in grants and loans while attending North Carolina Central University from 2007 to 2012 by making false statements on her application. The suspect's sister also obtained federal funds through falsifying income documents receiving \$113,188.

21. *October 17, Threatpost* – (International) **SAP patches DoS flaw in Netweaver.** SAP released a patch for its Netweaver platform that closes a remotely exploitable denial of service (DoS) vulnerability reported by Core Security researchers in June. The vulnerability could allow an unauthenticated attacker to use a specially crafted SAP

Enqueue Server packet to create the DoS condition.

22. October 17, IDG News Service – (International) New technique allows attackers to hide stealthy Android malware in images. Two researchers presenting at the Black Hat Europe conference October 16 revealed a technique dubbed AngeCryption that could allow an attacker to hide malicious Android applications inside image files in order to avoid detection by antivirus programs and potentially the Google Play store's malware scanner.

23. October 16, Softpedia – (International) XSS risk found in links to New York Times articles prior to 2013. A student reported and published a proof of concept for a vulnerability in articles on the New York Times Web site published before 2013 that could allow attackers to hijack browser sessions, direct users to phishing sites, or steal cookies by exploiting a cross-site scripting (XSS) flaw. The vulnerability exists on pages containing certain buttons and does not affect the most recent versions of popular Web browsers.

24. October 16, The Register – (International) Bad news, fandroids: He who controls the IPC tool, controls the DROID. Researchers with Check Point presenting at the Black Hat Europe conference October 16 detailed a flaw in the Android inter-process communication (IPC) tool Binder that could allow attackers to override in-app security features to tamper with apps and steal passwords and other information. 25. October 16, IDG News Service – (International) All-in-one printers can be used to control infected air-gapped systems from far away. A cryptographer and two researchers from Ben-Gurion University presenting at the Black Hat Europe conference October 16 demonstrated how an all-in-one printer could be used to issue commands to infected systems on an air-gapped network by shining infrared or visible light at the scanner lid when open, issuing commands to malware already planted on the system via USB drive or other method. The researchers were able to successfully test the method at a target printer inside a building at 200, 900, and 1,200 meters and stated that a more powerful laser could produce reliable results from up to 5 kilometers.
