Top Stories

- The U.S. Postal Service announced November 10 that the personal information of more than 800,000 employees and customers were potentially accessed in a cyberattack. – *Reuters* (See item 8)
- Thousands of food products worth more than \$3 million were scattered all over the roadway following an accident on Interstate 24 east near Monteagle, Tennessee, shutting down the interstate for more than 4 hours November 9. *Chattanooga Times Free Press* (See item 9)

1. November 7, Cleveland Plain Dealer – (Ohio) Perry nuclear power plant shut itself down Friday morning without incident. The reactor at the Perry nuclear power plant in North Perry experienced an automatic shutdown November 7. A preliminary investigation determined that a voltage issue in one of the electrical panels that supplies power to cooling pumps was the cause of the shutdown.

- 2. November 8, Associated Press (National) Nissan recalls 52,000 vehicles for faulty air bags. Nissan announced November 8 that it is recalling 52,738 Nissan and Infiniti vehicles due to airbag inflators manufactured by Takata Corp., which could explode upon airbag deployment and send metal shards into the passenger compartment. Affected models include model year 2003-2004 Nissan Pathfinder, 2004-2006 Sentra, 2003-2005 Infiniti FX 35 and FX 45, 2003-2004 I35, and 2006 M35 and M45 vehicles. - 3. November 7, Associated Press (California) Convicted felon arrested in scheme to embezzle \$8.5 million as Gulfstream finance director. The former finance director of Gulfstream Aerospace Corp.'s Long Beach and Las Vegas operations was arrested November 7 and charged with allegedly using fake companies to bill Gulfstream for at least \$8.5 million in fraudulent charges and using the stolen funds for his personal use. The Calabasas man was fired by Gulfstream in 2013 after the company found that he had lied on a 2000 application regarding a conviction for embezzling \$2.4 million from a previous employer.

- 4. November 7, WSB 750 AM Atlanta (Georgia) Massive credit card scam found in Paulding Co. Authorities in Paulding County arrested a Kennesaw man for allegedly operating a payment card forgery operation after police were contacted by the owner of an office building who had discovered suspicious items while cleaning out the office space of an evicted tenant. Police found 1,154 payment cards as well as card embossing devices and several fraudulent driver's licenses from various States.

- 5. November 7, Amarillo Globe-News (Texas) Troopers seize nearly \$200k in fake credit cards, cash. Texas Department of Public Safety troopers arrested two Romanian nationals after they found 69 fraudulent payment cards valued at \$172,000 and 29 fraudulent ID cards from Iowa during a traffic stop in Carson County November 4. Troopers stated that they believed the contraband and \$18,000 in cash was being transported from California to Tennessee.

- 6. November 7, KIRO 7 Seattle (Washington) 'Roscoe Bandit' strikes Olympia bank. A suspect known as the "Roscoe Bandit" linked to two bank robberies in Seattle was also linked to an October 30 robbery of Timberland Bank in Olympia. The previous Seattle robberies occurred July 29 at a Wells Fargo Bank branch and July 28 at a HomeStreet Bank branch.

- 7. November 7, Chicago Sun-Times (Illinois) 'Bully Bandit' suspected of three more bank robberies. The FBI is offering a reward for information on the "Bully Bandit" after the suspect was linked to 3 additional robberies in the Chicago area, bringing the suspect's total to 15 bank robberies since 2012. The most recent bank robbery occurred November 5 at a Chase Bank branch in Chicago.

8. November 10, Reuters – (National) U.S. Postal Service says data breach hits employees, call center. The U.S. Postal Service (USPS) announced November 10 that the personal information, including Social Security numbers, of more than 800,000 employees and customers who called the Postal Service Customer Care Center between January and August 16 was potentially accessed in a cyberattack. The USPS is investigating and reported that the intrusion is limited in scope and operations are functioning normally.

- 9. November 10, Chattanooga Times Free Press (Tennessee) Meat, eggs and cheese only casualties of I-24 pileup on Monteagle. Thousands of eggs, cheese, and boxes of meat worth more than \$3 million collectively were scattered all over the roadway following an accident between 3 semi-trucks and 2 cars on Interstate 24 east near Monteagle, shutting down the interstate for more than 4 hours November 9 while crews cleared the scene. One driver was injured in the incident.

- 10. November 10, WFMZ 69 Allentown (Pennsylvania) Route 61 in Hamburg closed for hours after U.S. mail truck accident. Southbound lanes of Route 61 in Berks County were closed for nearly 8 hours after a U.S. mail truck swerved off the roadway and plummeted down an 80 foot embankment in an effort to miss hitting a deer. - 11. *November 8, Charlotte Observer* (North Carolina) **Train slams into lettuce truck in Bessemer City.** A portion of the Norfolk Southern tracks in Bessemer City were closed for approximately 3 hours for cleanup November 8 following a collision between a semi-truck carrying lettuce and a train at a rail road crossing on South 8th Street. - 12. *November 6*, *WITI 6 Milwaukee* (Wisconsin) **Semi rollover leads to extreme backups on I-94/43 in Plainfield Curve.** A semi-truck carrying 78,000 pounds of grain overturned and crashed into a light pole leading to the closure of 2 northbound and 2 southbound lanes of Interstate 43 near Howard Avenue in Milwaukee for 6 hours November 6.

13. November 9, U.S. Department of Agriculture – (Hawaii) Hawaii firm recalls frozen pork products due to misbranding and undeclared allergen. The Food Safety and Inspection Service reported November 9 that Kulana Foods Ltd., issued a recall for about 4,465 pounds of Mountain Apple Brand Teri Smoked Pork products due to undeclared wheat caused by misbranding. The products were distributed to retailers and foodservice locations on the islands of Hawaii and Oahu.

November 8, U.S. Food and Drug Administration – (International) Marin Food Specialties, Inc. initiates voluntary recall of imported Organic Raw Almonds (bitter almonds) due to elevated levels of naturally occurring hydrogen cyanide. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration announced November 7 that Marin Foods Specialties, Inc., issued a recall of its Organic Raw Almonds (bitter almonds) due to the possibility that they contain elevated levels of naturally occurring hydrogen cyanide based on laboratory test results. The products were imported from Italy and Spain and sold in 13.5 ounce containers at Whole Foods Market stores in California, Oregon, Washington, Nevada, and Idaho.

15. November 8, Food Safety News – (National) Recalled bean sprouts linked to 2
Listeria deaths, 3 hospitalizations. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and
Prevention reported that 2 individuals died and 3 others were hospitalized between June
and August after consuming Wholesome Soy Products-branded bean sprouts that were
determined to be contaminated with Listeria monocytogenes. The Illinois Department
of Public Health is working to embargo all products from the company after follow-up
inspections by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration revealed additional
environmental samples with Listeria contamination.

16. November 9, Orange County Register – (California) Sewage spill closes 15 docks in Dana Point. Orange County Health Care Agency officials announced a no swimming and diving advisory until further notice November 9 following a sewage spill that led to the closure of 15 docks in Dana Point Harbor after tests came back positive for elevated levels of bacteria. The advisory also warned beachgoers to avoid contact with the water at Harbor Tower Marina, Pacific Coast Highway, and Newport Boulevard due to potential urban runoff.

21. *November 10, Pittsburgh Tribune-Review* – (Pennsylvania) **Franklin Regional High School students sent home after bomb threat.** Students were evacuated and classes were dismissed at Franklin Regional High School in Murrysville due to a bomb threat November 10. Authorities reported to the campus to investigate.

Officials announced November 7 that the Statewide online catalog of the Wyoming State Library was taken offline for 2 days for remediation after authorities learned the system was breached October 7 by unknown hackers. The attack was discovered after unusual activity was detected on the system and there is no indication that personal data was compromised.

Corizon Health, a sub-contracting medical firm, launched an investigation after two nurses did not follow proper medical procedures and administered the wrong shots.

26. *November 10, Securityweek* – (International) **Darkhotel attackers target business travelers via hotel networks.** Kaspersky Lab researchers identified an advanced persistent threat (APT) group dubbed Darkhotel APT that has targeted travelers in the

Asia-Pacific region in addition to the U.S. using malicious hotel WiFi networks, spear phishing, and malicious torrent files. The group's hotel attacks involve prompting users with a software update notice that installs a backdoor, and the group has targeted guests associated with industries and sectors including government organizations, the defense industry, energy industry, pharmaceutical industry, electronics manufacturers, medical providers, and non-governmental organizations.

27. November 10, The Register – (International) BrowserStack HACK ATTACK: Service still suspended after rogue email. Browser testing service BrowserStack stated that it was temporarily suspending service to recover after an attacker managed to gain access to a list of email addresses and the company's official email account, using it to send out a fake message to developers.

Researchers at Cisco reported that the instant messaging client Pidgin contained three security vulnerabilities that could have allowed attackers to overwrite files or cause a denial of service (DoS) situation. The vulnerabilities have since been patched.

Approximately 579 Frontier Communications customers from Quarryville to Caernarvon Township in Lancaster County were without phone service for several hours November 9 after a vehicle struck and damaged a pole at the intersection of Routes 340 and 772.

- 35. *November 8, San Jose Mercury News* (California) **San Jose: All-clear given after downtown natural-gas leak.** About 2,500 people were evacuated from office buildings in downtown San Jose and around 2,500 additional people were ordered to

shelter-in-place November 7 while crews worked to repair a 4 inch natural gas pipeline that was inadvertently struck by a construction crew working in the area. The scene was cleared November 8 after HAZMAT crews tested buildings for possible pockets of gas that could be trapped inside, and service was expected to be restored to the 40 affected businesses by November 10.
