1. November 20, WSAZ 3 Huntington – (Kentucky) Crews working to remove leaked oil after fire at Kentucky Power substation. Firefighters controlled a fire at Kentucky Power's Baker substation in Louisa November 20 following a transformer explosion. Crews removed over 3,000 gallons of non-PCB lubricating oil that leaked into a nearby ditch at the substation and were monitoring the blaze that was estimated to continue burning for several hours.

2. November 20, Palm Beach Post – (Florida) Feds increase oversight of FPL's St. Lucie nuclear power plant. The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission announced November 20 that it is increasing its oversight of the St. Lucie Unit 1 reactor in Jensen Beach due to violations linked to plant operator Florida Power & Light's failure to ensure that the reactor's auxiliary building was watertight. The operator agreed to take corrective actions to repair flood seals, increase inspections of flood protection features, and revise flood response procedures.

3. November 19, U.S. Department of Labor – (Virginia) **OSHA finds shipyard workers** repeatedly exposed to life-threatening safety and health hazards at Norfolk, Virginia, facility. The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Colonna's Shipyard Inc.'s ship repair facility in Norfolk November 19 for 12 safety and health violations following a May 2014 inspection that revealed unguarded manholes and other fall risks, defective equipment, and electrical hazard exposures. Proposed penalties total \$101,000.

4. November 19, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission – (National) AP Specialties recalls Power Bank chargers due to fire hazard. AP Specialties announced a recall

of about 172,000 Power Bank device chargers due to the potential for the chargers to overheat, posing a fire hazard. The chargers were distributed as promotional items at trade shows, industry conventions, and meetings between November 2013 and August 2014.

- 5. November 19, Associated Press (National) VW recalls 442,000 cars to fix suspension problem. Volkswagen initiated a recall for 442,000 model year 2011-2013 Jetta and 2012-2013 Beetle vehicles due the potential for the vehicles' rear trailing arms to fracture suddenly if they are damaged in a crash and not repaired correctly. Proposed fines totaled \$59,290.

About 50 cattle were removed from the structure and no injuries were reported.

Crews used chainsaws to make relief cuts around the bin and release soybeans before the man could be rescued.

17. November 19, U.S. Department of Agriculture – (Pennsylvania) Pennsylvania firm recalls pork products due to misbranding and undeclared allergens. The Food Safety and Inspection Service announced November 19 that K. Heeps, Inc. issued a recall for about 2,902 pounds of Stryker Farm-branded bratwurst and bangers products due to undeclared soy lecithin caused by misbranding. The products were distributed to restaurants and retailers in Pennsylvania by a single vendor.

18. *November 19, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (California; Pennsylvania; Texas) California firm recalls sausage products due to misbranding and undeclared allergen. The Food Safety and Inspection Service reported November 19 that Sapar USA, Inc., doing business as Fabrique Delices, issued a recall for about12 pounds of

sausage products due to misbranding and undeclared nonfat dry milk. The product yields a production date of November 6 and was sold through distribution centers in California, Pennsylvania, and Texas to retail and institutional outlets.

19. November 19, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency – (Connecticut) EPA settlement reduces risk of ammonia releases from North Haven, Conn. cold storage facility. Bozzuto's Inc., entered into a settlement with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and agreed to pay \$124,181 to resolve alleged violations of the Clean Air Act including the improper handling of anhydrous ammonia at the company's cold storage warehouse in North Haven. Bozzuto's also spent more than \$500,000 to bring its facilities in North Haven and Cheshire into compliance with federal regulations, and voluntarily installed an ammonia detection system and computerized automatic shutdown control system at the sites.

20. November 19, U.S. Department of Labor – (Nebraska) OSHA cites Double Dutch Dairy after worker fatally injured by front-end loader in Shelby, Nebraska.

Double Dutch Dairy was cited by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration for 4 serious safety violations revealed during an inspection of the company's Shelby, Nebraska, facility following a June 2014 worker fatality. The investigation revealed the driver of a front-end loader had an obstructed view which led to a second worker being fatally struck-by the equipment.

ins in CryptoPHP blackhat SEO campaign. Researchers with Fox-IT identified a group of attackers using compromised WordPress themes and plugins to deliver a piece of malware dubbed CryptoPHP that engages in fraudulent search engine optimization (SEO) operations. The malware can also inject content into sites using the compromised plugins and themes, update itself, and perform other tasks.

- 33. November 20, Securityweek (International) Developers fix XSS vulnerability in jQuery Validation Plugin script. The developers of the jQuery Validation Plugin issued a fix for a vulnerability present in the plugin's demo code that could have allowed an attacker to engage in session hijacking using a reflected cross-site scripting (XSS) attack. - 34. November 20, Threatpost (International) Angler exploit kit adds new Flash exploit for CVE-2014-8440. A security researcher reported that the Angler exploit kit has been equipped with an exploit for the CVE-2014-8440 vulnerability in Adobe Flash that can be used to take control of target systems. The vulnerability was patched by Adobe November 11 but unpatched systems remain vulnerable.

- 37. November 19, Network World (International) FTC gets federal court to shut down \$120M tech support scam. The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) announced November 19 that a federal court granted its request to temporarily shut down two telemarketing operations that allegedly defrauded consumers out of more than \$120 million by convincing them to grant the marketers remote access and deceiving them into paying for services and products to solve nonexistent computer problems. The companies involved include PC Cleaner, Boost Software, and Inbound Call Experts,

and the defendants are the targets of separate cases filed by the FTC and the State of Florida.

38. *November 19*, *Softpedia* – (International) **Privilege escalation risk fixed in Android Lollipop, lower versions vulnerable.** A researcher who identified and reported a flaw in the Android operating system that could allow an attacker to execute arbitrary code released a proof-of-concept for the vulnerability following the November 3 release of a patch that closes the vulnerability in Android Lollipop (also known as Android 5.0). The vulnerability is still present on previous Android versions.

45. November 18, Associated Press – (Washington) Reservoir behind Wanapum Dam to begin filling. The Grant County Public Utility District announced that the Wanapum Dam in Ephrata could resume normal operations by May 2015 after a 65-foot crack was discovered in its spillway in February, prompting authorities to lower the reservoir behind the Columbia River dam to 26 feet and ban the public from the shoreline for safety. Thirty-five anchor cables will be drilled into the bedrock for strength and 70 anchor bars will be bolted into the spillway to repair the crack.
