Top Stories

- The New Mexico Environment Department issued over \$54 million in penalties to the U.S. Department of Energy December 6 accusing the agency of more than 30 violations of State permits at the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant and at Los Alamos National Laboratory. Associated Press (See item 14)
- A December 8 fire at the under-construction DaVinci apartment complex in Los Angeles damaged nearby buildings, including a city government facility, and shutdown the 110 Freeway for several hours. Los Angeles Times (See item 21)

1. December 5, Greensboro News & Record – (North Carolina) 2,000 gallons of ethanol spills in Greensboro. Authorities are investigating after a semi-truck carrying ethanol ruptured, spilling about 2,000 gallons of ethanol December 5 after the landing gear used to hold the truck upright collapsed at a Ryder Truck Rental facility in south Greensboro. Crews worked on cleaning the fuel after it leaked onto the parking lot and drained into a tributary of South Buffalo Creek.

3. December 5, Springfield Republican – (International) Chinese man accused of smuggling Massachusetts-made parts for nuclear weapons to Iran extradited to Boston. A Chinese citizen was extradited from the U.K. to the U.S. December 5 on charges that the man allegedly conspired to fraudulently export over 1,000 pressure transducers manufactured by MKS Instruments from the U.S. to China and then on to Iran, in violation of U.S. sanctions restricting materials that can be used by Iran's nuclear program.

4. **December 8**, **Securityweek** – (International) **New variant of Neverquest banking trojan targets North America.** Researchers with IBM Trusteer reported December 5 that they have observed a new variant of the Neverquest banking trojan being used predominantly against financial institutions in North America, with some additional targets in the media, gaming, and social networking industries. The malware has been distributed by drive-by downloads using exploit kits as well as by the Chaintor and Zemot trojan downloaders.

- 5. December 5, New York Times (New York) Pizza orders reveal credit card scheme, and a secondhand market. Police in New York City conducted a sweep that led to 14 arrests November 13-14 after it was found that criminals using stolen payment card information were placing orders through a Domino's mobile app in order to test which stolen card numbers were able to be charged to. Card numbers that were able to be successfully charged to were then used for larger fraudulent purchases.

(Fleur De Sel) Premium Ice Cream sold between November 4 and December 5
nationwide after the recipe's caramel cups ingredient was replaced with peanut butter
cups due to a supply error. The affected ice cream was sold at all Safeway, Carrs,
Genuardi's, Pak 'N Save, Pavilions, Randalls, Tom Thumb, and Vons stores.

Authorities are investigating a December 8 fire at the under-construction DaVinci apartment complex in downtown Los Angeles that engulfed almost 1 million square feet and a city block, damaged nearby buildings, including a city government facility, and shutdown a portion of northbound and southbound lanes of the 110 Freeway for several hours while firefighters worked to put out the blaze and hot spots.

Several co-conspirators were previously convicted and sentenced for their roles in the fraud ring.

An intentional chlorine gas leak left 19 people hospitalized with symptoms of nausea and dizziness, and evacuated thousands of people for 2 hours from the Hyatt hotel in Rosemont, Illinois, December 7 during an annual convention. Authorities found a substance consistent with powdered chlorine in a stairwell at the hotel and decontaminated the area.

- 26. December 5, News 12 Westchester (New York) All-clear given at Yonkers building after hazmat spill. A hazardous material spill at 1 Odell Ave. in Yonkers caused the 3 hour evacuation of approximately 100 people from several businesses and a day care center after an employee accidentally spilled 3 gallons of nitrate and sulfuric acid at Crestwood Technology Group. - 27. December 5, Orlando Sentinel (Florida) Evacuation lifted for 3 stores in Waterford Lakes area after bomb-squad probe. Authorities cleared the scene after nothing suspicious was found.
