Top Stories

- Rail service for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority's Blue, Orange, and Silver lines that run through downtown Washington, D.C. was partially suspended for about 3 hours December 16 due to a water main break that caused flooding in a subway station. WTOP 103.5 Washington, D.C. (See item 4)
- The Associated Milk Producers Inc. cheese packaging plant in Portage, Wisconsin, is expected to resume operations the week of December 15 after a fire broke out in a storage area at the facility December 12 and prompted the evacuation of about 70 employees. *Portage Daily Register* (See item 14)
- Crews continued efforts to clean up and disinfect the streets of Georgetown, South Carolina, December 16 after a water main carrying wastewater to the city's treatment plant was found leaking an estimated 267,000 gallons of untreated wastewater. WCSC 5 Charleston (See item 15)
- The owner of Pharmacare and Caremerica, a pharmacy chain, pleaded guilty before a federal jury in Baltimore, Maryland, December 15 to submitting false claims for prescription refills and defrauding Medicaid and Medicare of \$1.5 million. *Associated Press* (See item 17)

scripting (XSS) vulnerability in a Web site belonging to Citibank that could allow the personal information, login credentials, and cookies of users and administrators to be stolen.

4. **December 16, WTOP 103.5 Washington, DC** – (Washington, D.C.) **Metro's Blue, Orange, Silver lines resume service after main break.** The Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority partially suspended rail service on the Blue, Orange, and Silver lines that run through downtown Washington, D.C. for about 3 hours December 16 due to a water main break that submerged rails underwater, affecting tens of thousands of commuters. Crews worked to repair the ruptured water main which was expected to take at least 13 hours.

- 5. December 15, KTVZ 21 Bend (Oregon) Lake Oswego man killed in crash on slick Hwy. 97. Winter weather conditions contributed to a string of accidents on roadways in Bend, Oregon, December 15, including one accident that prompted Highway 97 to close for more than 3 hours and a second collision that closed Highway 126 for almost 3 hours. Freezing fog December 14 December 15 also prompted the delay and cancellation of several flights at Redmond Airport.

- 6. December 15, Asbury Park Press (New Jersey) Truck accident in Howell shuts down Route 9 South. A semi-truck overturned and spilled 20 tons of stone on Route 9 near Ford Road in Howell Township December 15 blocking all four southbound lanes for nearly 3 hours.

- 7. December 15, Bay City News (California) Weather causing SFO flight delays. San Francisco International Airport officials reported that inclement weather December 15 prompted the cancellation of around 80 flights and delayed several more flights. Officials implemented a ground delay program that was used to slow the rate of arriving flights and was expected to last at least 16 hours.

- 10. *December 16*, *KWOA 730 AM Worthington* (Minnesota) **7,500 turkeys lost in fire in Lorain Township.** A December 16 fire at the Meyer Turkey Farm in Lorain Township engulfed a barn and killed about 7,500 turkeys housed in the structure. Authorities are investigating the blaze that is believed to be electrical in nature.

- 11. December 15, KAAL 6 Austin (Minnesota) Dangerous chemical leak under investigation. The Minnesota Department of Agriculture is investigating after about 9,000 gallons of anhydrous ammonia leaked at the Watonwan Farm Service-owned Clarks Grove Fertilizer facility in Freeborn County December 15 prompting the evacuation of 15 nearby homes. The leak was contained and one firefighter was treated at the scene for inhalation issues.

12. December 15, Associated Press – (International) Indictment accuses US halal beef supplier of misleading Muslims about slaughter methods. Cedar Rapids-based Midamar Corp., its directors, and a second company operated by the directors were indicted on charges unsealed December 5 for allegedly selling at least \$4.9 million in beef mislabeled as halal to customers worldwide, falsifying export documentation, wire fraud, and other charges after the employees removed labels and replaced them with fraudulent halal-certified labels.

13. *December 15*, *U.S. Department of Labor* – (Wisconsin) **Extreme temperatures and other safety hazards found at Birds Eye Foods plant in Darien, Wisconsin.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Birds Eye Foods Inc. for 1 repeat and 12 serious safety violations after a May inspection of the company's frozen-food

processing plant in Darien revealed that workers were exposed to extreme temperatures without proper protective equipment in addition to other slip, trip, and fall hazards. Proposed penalties total \$109,400.

14. *December 14*, *Portage Daily Register* – (Wisconsin) **AMPI manager hopes plant shutdown will be brief after fire Friday.** About 70 employees were evacuated from the Associated Milk Producers Inc. cheese packaging plant in Portage December 12 after a fire broke out in a storage area at the facility. Officials were investigating the fire and hoped to resume operations at the plant during the week of December 15. 16. December 16, IDG News Service— (Illinois) Illinois hospital reports data blackmail. Clay County Hospital in Illinois notified affected patients after receiving an anonymous e-mail containing protected health information of some patients asking for a substantial payment to avoid patient data being released. Law enforcement agencies were notified and an investigation found the compromised data was limited to patients who visited the hospital on or before February 2012 and limited to name, physical address, social security numbers and date of birth.

 Office of Personnel Management in Washington, D.C. prompted an evacuation of
 employees and caused power outages at several government buildings for several hours
 December 15 due to a mechanical failure with an electrical transformer. The lights at
 the White House also flickered briefly in an unrelated accident when a cable was
 severed during construction.

- 26. December 16, Securityweek (International) Banking trojan abuses Pinterest in C&C routines. Researchers with Trend Micro identified a variant of the BANKER malware known as TSPY_BANKER.YYSI that is currently targeting users of South Korean banking Web sites via redirection to a phishing site and accesses comments on the Pinterest social network instead of a command and control (C&C) server. - 27. December 16, Securityweek (International) CA Technologies fixes vulnerable CA Release Automation. CA Technologies released a patch for its CA Release Automation continuous delivery system that closes a cross-site request forgery (CSRF), cross-site scripting (XSS), and SQL injection vulnerability in previous versions of the product.

28. December 15, Threatpost – (International) Shellshock worm exploiting unpatched QNAP NAS devices. Researchers with the SANS Institute stated that network attached storage (NAS) devices manufactured by QNAP may still be vulnerable to attackers exploiting the Bash flaw that was patched previously due to the complexity and lack of automation in the patching process. The researchers published two hashes that have been used in recent attacks to perform click fraud against the JuiceADV advertising network

The Amazon.com Inc. headquarters in Seattle was evacuated and employees were sent home as a precaution December 15 after a threating note was found in a bathroom within the office building. Police investigated and cleared the scene after finding that no threat existed.

31. December 15, WPXI 11 Pittsburgh – (Pennsylvania) 8 hospitalized, dozens displaced after carbon monoxide leak in Baldwin. Eight residents were sent to area hospitals, including four that were labeled "red patients" following a carbon monoxide leak at the Westminster Apartments complex in Baldwin December 15. Residents from about 25 apartment units were temporarily displaced while crews worked to contain the leak that

32. December 15, WLOS 13 Asheville – (North Carolina) Water department estimates water to return by Monday morning. A city water department official reported that the entire 14-foot water line would be repaired before service was restored December 15.
