1. December 26, Washington Observer-Reporter – (Pennsylvania) Fire at Chartiers gas meter station causes evacuations. A December 24 fire at the Williams Partners L.P. station in Chartiers Township prompted the evacuation of roughly a dozen homes for several hours while crews worked to contain the blaze. The cause of the fire is under investigation while company personnel assess the total amount of damage in order to determine when the facility will return to service.

2. December 24, Louisville Courier-Journal – (Kentucky) Air board fines Rubbertown chemical plant. American Synthetic Rubber Co., agreed to pay \$27,000 in penalties to resolve allegations by the Louisville Metro Air Pollution Control District that the company's Rubbertown, Kentucky chemical plant was responsible for multiple excess releases of butadiene and toluene on several occasions since 2010. The agreement also resolved allegations that the company failed to repair leaking equipment and failed to follow proper reporting procedures.

3. December 29, Springfield Republican – (Vermont) Vermont Yankee nuclear power plant unplugs from the grid for good this week. The Vermont Yankee nuclear plant in Vernon shut down operations permanently December 29 due to economic reasons while the reactor has been under a coast down period since September. All spent nuclear fuel will be transferred to on-site dry cask storage until the U.S. Department of Energy authorizes its removal.

- 5. December 29, Wall Street Journal (New Jersey) Pershing LLC fined \$3 million for reserve level, supervisory failures. The Financial Industry Regulatory Authority fined Pershing LLC, a unit of the Bank of New York Mellon Corp., \$3 million December 29 for failing to maintain certain reserve levels and for supervisory failures after regulators discovered the company violated U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission's customer protection rule. The company had reserve deficiencies ranging from \$4 million to \$220 million from November 2010 to August 2011 and put securities to risk by failing to maintain physical possession of some fully paid and margin securities. 12. December 29, Food Business News – (National) Two companies recalling caramel apples following listeria outbreak. Happy Apple Co., issued a recall December 24 for its caramel apples with a best use date between August 25 and November 23 and California Snack Foods issued a recall December 27 for Karm'l Dapple brand caramel apples manufactured between August 15 and November 28 after the companies received notice from a supplier, Bidart Brothers Apple Packing, that the apples used in the products may be connected to a Listeria outbreak that has sickened 29 people in 10 States. The companies are working with federal regulators while they investigate the outbreak and encouraged consumers to follow a previously issued advisory to avoid consumption of commercially produced, pre-packaged caramel apples. over 320,000 lbs. of meat. Texas-based food producers, J&B Sausage Co., H-E-B Meat Center, and Garcia Foods, Inc., recalled more than 320,000 pounds of combined meat products due to undeclared peanuts caused by misbranding. Four of the affected products were sold in H-E-B stores and also sent to the Garland Independent School District in Texas.

The affected products were sold at retail stores nationwide and through Web-based sales.

The FDA approved the use of the test for a limited period which can generate results in approximately 3 hours.

The Lizard Squad hacker group allegedly claimed responsibility for the DDoS attack which also took down Microsoft's Xbox Live through December 26, and the group claimed that the Tor network was its next target for a zero-day attack.

- 26. December 27, Softpedia (International) Exploit for Android same origin policy flaw is leveraged against Facebook users. Researchers with Trend Micro, Facebook, and BlackBerry are working to detect and resolve an attack targeting Facebook users using a campaign relying on a Blackberry app to steal access tokens which uses the same origin policy (SOP) exploit flaw in the Web browser of the Android OS lower than 4.4. The attackers rely on the vulnerability to serve a malicious JavaScript file to victims which is stored in a cloud storage account.

Administrators urged users to check their computers while they investigated the apparent issue with the content management system (CMS) after visitors were redirected to a malicious location hosting Angler Exploit Kit (EK). Police continue to investigate the incident and determined that the suspected gunfire was actually the sound of pots banging together by a food court merchant who was trying to disperse the crowds.
