## Nuclear Reactors, Materials, and Waste Sector

1. *December 6, Idaho State Journal* – (Idaho) **US to build \$1.6B east Idaho facility for warships' nuclear waste.** The U.S. Navy and the U.S. Department of Energy announced December 6 the construction of a new \$1.65 billion Expanded Core Facility in eastern Idaho that will handle radioactive waste from the Navy's fleet of nuclear-powered warships. Site preparation is set to begin in 2017 and the facility is expected to commence operations in late 2024.

## Critical Manufacturing Sector

2. *December 6, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Ohio) **OSHA finds workers exposed to machine, electrical hazards.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited NN Metal Stampings Inc. with nine serious and two other-than-serious safety violations December 2 after a complaint alleging unsafe working conditions at the Pioneer, Ohio facility prompted an August 2016 inspection which revealed that the company exposed workers to operating parts of machinery, failed to properly train employees on machine safety procedures, and neglected to provide adequate personal protective equipment for workers performing electrical work, among other violations. Proposed penalties total \$77,322.

## Financial Services Sector

3. *December 6, U.S. Attorney's Office, Western District of New York* – (New York) **Buffalo man convicted of multiple bank robberies.** A Buffalo, New York resident pleaded guilty December 6 to committing or helping to commit six bank robberies at First Niagara Bank and KeyBank branches in Buffalo, Lancaster, and Depew, New York.

4. *December 6, U.S. Attorney's Office, Middle District of Pennsylvania* – (National) **Florida woman guilty of interstate stolen credit card scheme.** A Ft. Lauderdale, Florida woman pleaded guilty December 6 after she and co-conspirators used stolen credit cards to fraudulently purchase Apple iPads, iPods, MacBooks, and other electronic goods and gift cards from Target Corporation, Best Buy, and other stores in central Pennsylvania over the course of roughly 8 months from 2014 – 2015, resulting in an estimated total loss of \$179,500. The group broke into vehicles from Florida to Pennsylvania in order to steal the credit cards and victims' identification documents before making the fraudulent purchases.

## **Transportation Systems Sector**

5. *December 7, KTRK 13 Houston* – (Mississippi) **Passengers shaken by scare on Houston-bound Southwest Airlines flight.** Southwest Airlines Flight 214 en route to George Bush Intercontinental Airport in Houston from Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport in Atlanta was forced to make an emergency landing at Jackson-Evers International Airport in Jackson, Mississippi, December 7 due to a potential pressurization issue. The plane landed safely and no injuries were reported.

6. *December 6, USA Today* – (Washington) **Ride the Duck maker fined \$500,000 after fatal Seattle crash.** The U.S. Department of Transportation announced December 6 that Ride the Ducks International has agreed to pay a fine of \$500,000 for failing to adhere to a law requiring the business to recall vehicles with known safety defects after one of the company's amphibious vehicles crashed on the Aurora Bridge in Seattle in September 2015, killing 5 students and injuring 69 others. Officials state that if the company violates the Safety Act again, it will be fined another \$500,000.

7. *December 6, Utica Observer-Dispatch* – (New York) **Officials: Fuel spill cleanup could take most of the night.** Portions of New York State Route 12, New York State Route 8, and New York State Route 840 in Utica were closed for several hours December 6 while HAZMAT crews worked to clean a fuel spill after a semi-truck overturned on the entrance ramp to the southbound lanes of Route 8. Officials estimated that several thousand gallons of gasoline leaked out of the truck.

8. *December 5, Victor Valley News* – (California) **Adelanto man killed in Highway 395 Crash ID'd.** U.S. Route 395 near San Bernardino, California, was closed for 12 hours

December 4 – December 5 after a vehicle traveling southbound drifted into the northbound lanes and collided head-on with a northbound vehicle, killing one person and injuring another. An investigation is ongoing.

## **Food and Agriculture Sector**

9. *December 6, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **FMIF Holdings, LLC urges consumers of 8oz pods purchased online to dispose of product immediately.** FMIF Holdings, LLC issued a recall November 23 of its Snow Monkey Goji Berry and Cacao products sold in 8-ounce containers due to potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after *Listeria* was discovered in the continuous freezer line at the firm's former manufacturing plant, Dr. Bob's of Upland, LLC. No illnesses or adverse reactions have been reported and the products were distributed via online orders to 17 States and Washington D.C.

10. *December 5, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **National Steak and Poultry recalls ready-to-eat chicken that may be undercooked.** National Steak and Poultry expanded a previous recall December 4 to include approximately 1,976,089 additional pounds of its ready-to-eat chicken products due to adulteration because of possible undercooking discovered after the firm received a customer complaint stating that the product appeared to be undercooked. There have been no adverse reactions or illnesses reported and the products were sold directly to retail customers and to food service locations nationwide.

## **Water and Wastewater Systems Sector**

11. *December 7, KHON 2 Honolulu* – (Hawaii) **More than 200,000 gallons of sewage spilled near Ko Olina.** Ko Olina, Hawaii officials announced December 6 that a November 30 sewage spill caused 201,600 gallons of sewage to be released after a 16-inch water main broke, an increase from the more than 1,000-gallon estimate that the city initially reported. Officials stated that the sewage did not reach waterways and crews returned to deodorize the site the week of December 5 and apply another dose of disinfectant.

12. *December 6, KCRG 9 Cedar Rapids* – (Iowa) **4 Keokuk County communities under boil advisory.** The Wapello Rural Water Association in Iowa issued a boil water advisory for the cities of Harper, South English, Kinross, and rural Keota, as well as neighboring areas, until further notice after a water main broke December 6. Officials reported that the system has been repaired and re-pressurized, but the advisory will not be lifted until bacteria sample tests come back clean.

13. *December 6, KVPR 89.3 FM Fresno* – (California) **Kettleman City water treatment plant gets green light.** The California State Water Resources Control Board approved December 6 the construction of a new water treatment plant to serve Kettleman City following the discovery of unsafe levels of arsenic in the city's drinking water supply. The project will receive nearly \$10 million from State and Federal governments and construction is slated to begin in early 2017.

14. *December 6, WJTV 12 Jackson* – (Mississippi) **Central Rankin Water Association customers under boil water notice; E. coli found in water samples.** The Mississippi State Department of Health issued a boil water notice December 6 for 2,922 Central Rankin Water Association customers after water samples revealed the presence of E. coli bacteria. The boil water notice will last at least two full days and water system officials will be notified once the alert is lifted.

15. *December 6, WSAZ 3 Huntington* – (Kentucky) **Lawrence County, Ky. Schools closed Wednesday after chemical spill.** Officials closed Lawrence County School District Schools in Kentucky December 7 after a chemical spill at Lawrence County High School December 6. The spill was contained and crews were working to clean up additional damage to the tile and walls.

16. *December 6, New Hampshire Union Leader* – (New Hampshire) **Oyster River High evacuated after bomb threat found in bathroom.** Students at Oyster River High School in Durham, New Hampshire, were evacuated and dismissed several hours early December 6 after a bomb threat was found on a bathroom wall. Authorities found no signs of an explosive device and the threat remains under investigation.

17. *December 6, Baltimore Sun* – (Maryland) **Baltimore police detective indicted on theft charges, allegations he used fake diploma.** A detective who worked as a computer forensic analyst for Baltimore Police Department was charged the week of

November 28 with 2 counts of alleged theft of at least \$10,000 but less than \$100,000 for after he allegedly used a fake diploma. The investigation is ongoing.

## **Information Technology Sector**

18. *December 7, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Windows 10 Creators Update brings new security capabilities.** Microsoft reported that the Windows 10 Creators Update, which is scheduled to be released in the spring of 2017, will include several security enhancements including improved detection, intelligence, and remediation capabilities in Windows Defender Advanced Threat Protection (ATP), a feature that will link the Windows Security Center to Office 365 ATP to allow administrators to track a threat across endpoints and email, as well as expanded ATP sensors to detect kernel-level exploits and threats that occur only in memory, among other updated features.

19. *December 7, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Locky variant Osiris distributed via Excel documents.** BleepingComputer security researchers discovered that the Locky ransomware began appending the .osiris extension to encrypted files, while leveraging malicious Microsoft Excel spreadsheets for distribution. The Excel documents are hidden inside ZIP archives and attached to spam emails concealed as invoices, which contain macros that download and install Locky on a victim's device once enabled.

20. *December 6, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Google patches 74 vulnerabilities in Android.** Google released its December 2016 Android Security Bulletin which includes patches for a total of 74 vulnerabilities, including 11 critical flaws, a total of 43 high severity flaws, and 20 medium risk vulnerabilities. The critical flaw patches include a fix for the Dirty COW vulnerability, as well as an elevation of privilege vulnerability in kernel memory subsystem affecting Pixel C, Pixel, and Pixel XL devices, and elevation of privilege issues in NVIDIA GPU Driver, kernel, kernel ION driver, and the Qualcomm Mobile Station Modem (MSM) interface, among other patched flaws.

21. *December 6, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Flash Player remains main target of exploit kits: report.** Threat intelligence firm Recorded Future released a report after performing an analysis of 141 exploit kits (EKs), which found that Adobe Flash Player, Microsoft Windows, Internet Explorer, and Silverlight were the main targets of EKs in 2016. Flash Player accounted for 6 of the top 10 flaws leveraged by EKs, and an Internet Explorer flaw tracked as CVE-2016-0189, which was integrated into several EKs including Sundown, Neutrino, and RIG, was the most referenced vulnerability on security blogs and dark Websites.
