Top Stories

- The former president of the Bank of Union (BOU) in El Reno, Oklahoma, was charged December 13 after he and 4 co-conspirators allegedly caused the bank over \$100,000,000 in losses. – *U.S. Attorney’s Office, Western District of Oklahoma* (See item [2](#))

Critical Manufacturing Sector

1. *December 14, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Alabama) **Alabama auto parts supplier to Kia and Hyundai, staffing agencies face \$2.5M in fines after robot fatally crushes young bride-to-be.** The U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Joon LLC, doing business as Ajin USA, with 23 willful, serious, and other-than-serious violations, and cited its 2 staffing agencies with a total of 4 violations December 14 after the death of an employee prompted an investigation of the Cusseta, Alabama facility which revealed that the company failed to utilize control procedures to prevent machinery from starting up during maintenance, failed to provide safety locks to isolate hazardous energy, and exposed employees to crushing and amputation hazards due to improper machine guarding, among other violations. Proposed penalties for the three companies total \$2,565,621.

Financial Services Sector

2. *December 14, U.S. Attorney's Office, Western District of Oklahoma* – (Oklahoma) **Former bank president indicted in connection with \$100,000,000 bank failure.** The former president of the Bank of Union (BOU) in El Reno, Oklahoma, was charged December 13 after he and 4 co-conspirators allegedly defrauded BOU by issuing loans with under secured or unsecured collateral and falsifying financial statements for several bank borrowers, concealing the bank's true financial condition from the Board of Directors and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC), and originating nominee loans to circumvent the bank's legal lending limit, among other fraudulent actions, from 2009 – 2013, which caused the bank more than \$100,000,000 in losses. In January 2014, State banking regulators closed BOU due to the losses it incurred as a result of the scheme.

3. *December 14, North Andover Eagle Tribune* – (Massachusetts) **Officials deal with overturned tanker truck.** Massachusetts Route 28 was closed for several hours December 14 while HAZMAT crews worked to clean a spill after a semi-truck overturned, downing power lines and spilling up to 10,000 gallons of fuel on the roadway. The cause of the crash remains under investigation.

4. *December 14, WKRN 2 Nashville* – (Tennessee) **Semi crash, chemical fire closes I-24 for hours, prompts evacuations.** Interstate 24 in Rutherford County, Tennessee, was closed for over 12 hours December 14 after 2 semi-trucks collided, causing 1 to overturn and spill chlorine-based chemicals across the roadway, igniting a fire. Rutherford County Emergency Management crews evacuated 150 nearby homes due to HAZMAT concerns.

5. *December 14, KPNX 12 Mesa* – (Florida) **Orlando-bound Southwest flight from Phoenix diverted for medical emergency.** Southwest Airlines Flight 3016 traveling from Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport to Orlando International Airport in Florida was diverted December 14 to Northwest Florida Beaches International Airport in Panama City, Florida, due to a medical emergency.

6. *December 14, South Florida Sun-Sentinel* – (Florida) **Second truck crash on U.S. 27 spills tons of gravel.** Northbound lanes of U.S. Route 27 in Pembroke Pines, Florida, were closed for over 6 hours December 14 while crews worked to clear the debris after 2 semi-trucks collided and spilled 25 tons of gravel onto the roadway.

7. *December 14, WNCN 17 Goldsboro; WFMY 2 Greensboro* – (North Carolina) **Plane makes emergency landing at RDU.** American Eagle Flight 4370 en route to Pittsburgh International Airport from Raleigh-Durham International Airport in Morrisville, North Carolina, was forced to turn around and make an emergency landing in Morrisville December 14 after a light in the plane indicated an emergency. The plane landed safely and no one was injured.

8. *December 15, NewYorkUpstate.com* – (New York) **2,500 gallons of spilled cream turns Upstate NY creek white.** A dairy truck transporting cream to the Saputo Dairy Foods plant in Fraser, New York, overturned and spilled 2,500 gallons of cream into the Platner Brook in Delaware County December 14. HAZMAT crews from multiple departments responded to the scene.

9. *December 14, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Washington) **Thomas Hammer Coffee Roasters Inc. issues allergy alert on undeclared milk, egg, soy, wheat in the Cranberry Orange Scone.** Thomas Hammer Coffee Roasters Inc. issued a recall December 14 for 52 of its Cranberry Orange Scones products due to potential mislabeling and undeclared milk, egg, soy, and wheat after it was discovered that products containing milk, egg, soy, and wheat were distributed in packaging that did not reveal the presence of the allergens. No illnesses or adverse reactions have been reported and the products were distributed and sold at ten locations in Spokane and Spokane Valley, Washington.

10. *December 14, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (International) **H-E-B issues recall on raw shelled pistachios.** HEB Grocery Company, LP (HEB) issued a recall December 14 for both its bulk and packaged raw shelled pistachios products due to potential Salmonella contamination. No illnesses or adverse reactions have been reported and the products were sold in HEB and Central Market Texas stores.

11. *December 13, Associated Press* – (National) **ConAgra to pay \$11.2M to settle tainted peanut butter case.** The U.S. Department of Justice approved December 13 a guilty plea and an \$11.2 million settlement with a ConAgra Foods, Inc. subsidiary to resolve an investigation into a 2006 Salmonella outbreak linked to the firm's contaminated Peter Pan peanut butter that sickened at least 625 people in 47 States.

Water and Wastewater Systems Sector

12. *December 15, WECT 6 Wilmington* – (North Carolina) **10,000 gallons of untreated wastewater spills in Brunswick County.** Officials in Brunswick County, North Carolina, reported that about 10,000 gallons of untreated wastewater spilled from a sewer main in Shallotte December 14 due to a joint gasket failure. Crews isolated the spill and applied lime to stabilize the area, and officials were conducting testing to determine how much wastewater reached nearby waterways.

13. *December 15, KVUE 24 Austin* – (Texas) **Officials in Corpus Christi: Don't drink or use tap water.** City of Corpus Christi officials warned residents December 14 not to use tap water until further notice after an unknown petroleum-based substance may have contaminated the city's drinking water supply due to a back-flow incident in the industrial district. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported the substance will not likely cause adverse side-effects.

14. *December 14, Salisbury Post* – (North Carolina) **200,000 gallons of wastewater spills into Mocksville's Bear Creek.** A force main break near a tributary of Bear Creek in Mocksville, North Carolina, caused an estimated 200,000 gallons of untreated wastewater to spill into the creek in the South Yadkin River Basin December 13. Officials stated the force main break occurred after friction from rocks caused a pipe to fail.

15. *December 14, WTVA 9 Tupelo* – (Mississippi) **Pontotoc County water system issues boil-water notice.** Officials in Pontotoc County, Mississippi, issued a boil water notice for more than 600 customers served by the Houlika-Washington water system following a system-wide loss of water pressure due to one or more line breaks.

19. *December 14, SecurityWeek* – (International) **SAP resolves multiple information disclosure flaws.** SAP released its December 2016 security patches, which feature 20 Patch Day Security Notes and updates for 2 previously released notes to resolve a total of 31 vulnerabilities affecting several SAP products, including an information disclosure flaw in SAP Business Objects Explorer which could be leveraged to reveal additional information such as system data or debugging information, among other patched flaws. The updates also resolve three flaws in 2 SAP for Defense Forces & Public Security components that could allow an attacker to read, alter, or delete restricted data. 20. *December 14, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Yahoo says newly discovered hack hit 1 billion accounts.** Yahoo Inc. reported December 14 that the data associated with more than 1 billion user accounts may have been compromised in an August 2013 breach after attackers reportedly accessed the company's proprietary code to learn how to forge cookies. Yahoo officials claimed the breach was conducted by a State sponsored actor and the breach remains under investigation. 21. *December 14, Agence France-Presse* – (International) **Ashley Madison dating site to pay \$1.6 million over breach.** Ruby Corp., the parent company of the Ashley Madison discrete dating Website, agreed December 14 to pay a \$1.6 million penalty to settle charges with the U.S. Federal Trade Commission and State regulators after a hacker group released the data of 36 million users of the Website in 46 countries in 2015. The settlement requires Ashley Madison to implement a wide range of data security practice to better protect its users' personal information from malicious actors in the future. Two firefighters were injured and the cause of the fire remains under investigation.
